## Foundations for future learning



#### **EYFS curriculum – Early Years**

When children start school they will be in the Reception Year where learning will take place through The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) Curriculum. This is based on the Government's Early Learning Goals.



There are seven areas of learning:

- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Communication and Language
- Physical Development
- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design

Learning takes place through play and practical experiences, where children develop language skills, their emotions, creativity, social and intellectual skills. The topic based curriculum is designed to be flexible so that staff can respond to your child's unique needs and interests. The large outdoor areas are very well resourced and conducive to social and role play. Learning flows seamlessly between the indoor and outdoor environments to ensure the children access a range of experiences.



Prior to children joining our school, we arrange visits to enable a smooth and happy transition. Our school team liaise with your child's pre-school setting and visit your child there, talking with the key worker. We hold information evenings where parents meet staff who are on hand to share all the relevant information and answer questions. Your child will also stay and play on several occasions during June and July to familiarise themselves with the environment and adults. At the beginning of September, your child's class teacher and Learning Support Assistant will carry out a home visit prior to your child starting school.



## Key Stage One



After their Reception year, children move into Year 1 and then Year 2 which completes Infant education. In these years, children are working within the KS1 National Curriculum.

Areas of the curriculum are:

- Mathematics
- Literacy
- Science
- Information and Design Technology
- History
- Geography
- Art Music
- Physical Education
- Religious Education
- Citizenship
- Personal and Social Education.

Our curriculum is delivered through half termly topics such as Superheroes, To Infinity and Beyond and Amazing Africa. The theme is integrated across the subjects where possible in order for learning to have cohesion, meaning and purpose.



#### Learn to read, read to learn

At New Milton Infant School, we aim to teach all our pupils to 'learn to read' in order that they can 'read to learn' in other subjects. We also aim to promote a love of reading which will stay with the children for life. Our Library Bus is just one example of how we try to create a buzz of excitement about books. Children can join the well-stocked library to borrow books and are welcome to jump on board to read before and after school. The children love our library bus!

#### Writing

Children are taught the cursive letter formation from Reception which then helps them as they learn to 'join up' their handwriting in Years 1 and 2. Writing is purposeful and 'hooks' stimulate and engage the children in the writing process. In school research has revealed that children are confident to write when they know the subject retell a story by heart, is also embedded in our matter well, so we use story making, drama and oral rehearsal to ensure children have plenty of pre writing experiences.

#### **Speaking and Listening**

Acquiring a good standard of spoken English will underpin the development of reading and writing and is essential to communication as a whole. We value the use of drama across the whole curriculum to help children improve carry out practical application, then pictorial their speaking and listening skills. #### Maths

We provide open-ended problems for the children to solve, which help to foster an enquiring mind where Maths is seen as a challenge rather than a chore.

#### **Special educational needs**

#### Skilled staff

We invest in our staff, training them in a wide range of inclusive approaches to learning. We also maintain high levels of support staff in classrooms to maximise the adult to child ratio. Our full SEND policy can be found on our website.

#### Access

The school is accessible by a wheelchair, with some modifications to a few areas around school. There is a disabled toilet which is fully wheelchair accessible. We work physical environment is safe so that children can access their learning. We also seek support for families where necessary. There is a dedicated disabled parking bay and a portable ramp is available if required.



#### **The Acorn Room**

The purpose of the Acorn Group is to support children to develop their social and emotional skills within a small group setting. The nurturing and caring environment is led under the supervision of adults who are trained to meet children's needs. Reasons for attending are varied and include:

- the development of play skills
- emotional support with difficulties at home such as a bereavement or marriage breakdown
- self-regulation skills to develop appropriate and acceptable behaviour

#### **Speech and Language**

We have a specialist morning pre-school on site, the Early Learning Group, for children with a speech and language need. We are fortunate to have the trained staff available during the afternoons to support our infant pupils who may need additional language support.

## Feedback, assessment and

planning

When children join in Reception we carry out a baseline assessment to ascertain which stage your child is at in the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum. We use an online learning journal to track progress which you can access at home and contribute to during your child's time in Reception. Children in Reception are assessed against the Early Learning Goals.

#### **Next steps in children's** learning

Assessments and observations of children' learning take place throughout the year in all year groups. Teachers use ongoing assessments to plan the next steps in children's learning. Year 1 pupils undertake a national phonics screening check during the month of June. At the end of Year 2, attainment results in the core subjects are collected by the Department for Education.

#### **Educational visits and visitors**

To enhance learning, the children go on external visits during their time at our school. These are currently subsidised by 'FRIENDS', our group of dedicated parents who voluntarily give their time to raise funds. The visits are linked to a current learning topic, recent examples have included:

Additionally, we arrange enrichment weeks/days which can relate to national events or have a specific focus such as health, sport, culture or art.


We have high expectations of behaviour and a consistent approach is applied by all staff. We will always try to maintain pupils' selfesteem by showing them that we respect the child but reject poor behaviour. The emphasis at our school is always on good behaviour which is valued and rewarded through role model tea parties, whole class rewards and peer and individual recognition. Our behaviour procedures are explicit and shared with parents and children so they know and understand that sanctions will occur if good behaviour is not maintained.
