#### Our Aims and Values

The children utilise it to enhance and support their learning and are able to access resources easily to develop their independence. We have different learning areas to encourage a range of learning opportunities, such as an outdoor woodland classroom, a pond and an AstroTurf zone.

#### Pastoral care

Whilst academic achievements are an important part of life at our school, all our children also have the opportunity to enjoy a wide variety of sporting and musical opportunities, as well as regular trips. Our pastoral care is exceptional, ensuring all children are kept safe and are supported both inside and outside school.

#### Working in Partnership

We have a skilled and dedicated staff team who ensure that all of our children are well supported both emotionally and academically. We encourage our parents to be fully involved in their child's education. Our philosophy is one of partnership where parents and the school work closely together for the benefit of the child. ## **School hours**

The school day starts promptly at 9.00am but parents are welcome to bring their children to school from 8.45am. Our school day ends at 3.00pm.for all children.

## **Extended and Wraparound care**

The school's extended services include wraparound care with a breakfast and after school club; a 3+ club for prospective pupils; information and support from our Special Needs and Inclusion Leader and our Rainbow Team for wellbeing; opportunities for family learning as well as a wide variety of afterschool clubs run by school staff and external providers!

#### Breakfast Club

Our Breakfast Club runs from 7.30am-8.45amam with a range of fun activities and costs £4.50. Breakfast is served from 7.30am-8.15am.

#### After-School Club

Our After-School Club runs from 3.00pm - 6.00pm and costs £8.50. Tea is served between 3.30pm -4.00pm.

## School meals and snacks

#### Free school meals

The school provides a free nutritious, freshly cooked meal as part of a government initiative. Menus are available to view on the school website and children need to make a choice each day of whether they are taking the meat or vegetarian option. There is fresh bread baked daily and a range of salads and vegetables available to accompany your child's meal. A dedicated lunchtime lady accompanies each class and is on hand to support and encourage the children over the lunch break.

#### Break Time and drinks

All children are given their own named water bottle, have access to filtered water during the day and are encouraged to drink regularly. All classes are provided with free fresh fruit daily and children can subscribe to having a carton of milk if they wish.

#### Uniform

We believe that a school uniform helps to achieve a sense of belonging and identity. Our uniform is kept as simple and practical as possible to ensure children are comfortable and to enable independence. As well as the uniform, we ask that all children have a book bag and P.E. kit to help organise themselves for school.

# Our fantastic facilities



- Our exciting playground boasts space to run around and play with outdoor equipment as well as a volcano for climbing; a sandpit; a designated area for bikes, trikes and scooters; AstroTurf for ball games and a trim trail.
- Our new minibus enables us to take advantage of the wider learning opportunities within our community and beyond

# Curriculum: creative and inspiring



## Creative problem solving

Westmeads follows the statutory National Curriculum, and also runs a 'creative problem solving' approach. Connections are made between the different areas of teaching and learning to ensure children are encouraged to 'think about', 'question' and 'make links' for themselves, to develop their individual learning paths.

#### Personalised

Our curriculum approach assumes that all children have their own talents. Teaching and learning will be approached in an inclusive manner allowing all children to learn at a personalised level.

# The curriculum is divided into two stages

- 1. Early Years Foundation Stage: from ages 0-5
- 2. Key Stage 1: from ages 5-7



#### Reception

The Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum is based on seven areas of learning:

- Personal, Social and Emotional Development.
- Communication and Language.
- · Physical Development.
- · Literacy.
- Mathematics.
- Understanding the World.
- Expressive Arts and Design.

## Key Stage 1

In Years 1 and 2, subject areas covered by the curriculum policy are:

- English (Reading, Writing, Speaking and Listening and Phonics).
- Maths (Number and Calculation, Shape, Space and Measures, Data Handling).
- Computing (including e-safety).
- The Creative Arts (Design and Technology, Art and Design, Music, Physical Education).
- PSHE including well-being.
- Foundation subjects (Science, Environmental Study, Religious Education, History and Geography).

## Additional learning

During their time at Westmeads, our children will also participate in swimming lessons at the local pool; learn some basic French and Spanish; have the opportunity to cook; learn to play the recorder as well access music lessons taught by our peripatetic music teacher; use our school kiln; learn yoga, gentle touch and the importance of mindfulness as well as many other exciting things.

They also take part in regular class drama sessions and each year group gives a performance on stage each year.

#### Beach curriculum

We have also developed a curriculum that links learning from different areas of the curriculum directly to the local community and most especially the coast. The children visit our adopted area of the beach each week in terms 2, 4 and 6 to explore different subjects such as drama, art and photography, scientific opportunities, weather and the changing environment.

## School Council and Eco Council

We have active councils with class representatives who are encouraged to discuss and make decisions about a variety of issues to do with school. The children help to develop the ethos of the school, school policies and practice

## Valued and respected

It is the main aim of Westmeads Community
Infant School that every member of the school
community feels valued and respected, and
that each person is treated fairly and well.
The school's behaviour policy promotes an
environment in which everyone is entitled
to be nurtured and where everyone can feel
happy, safe and secure. We encourage children
to have a caring attitude towards each other.
It is made clear that it is not acceptable for any
children to be upset by the words or actions of
others.

## Rewards and responsibilities

We praise and reward children for good behaviour in a large variety of ways:

- Teachers congratulate children and may give them the 'Ask me what I did today?' badge to wear.
- Adults give individual children hand stampers and stickers for good work and achievements.
   Each week children who have achieved successfully are awarded a certificate in our Celebration Assembly
- Classes work collectively for good work and behaviour and are rewarded with a treat at the end of each term.

- The head teacher and deputy head teacher give stickers and certificates for good work and achievements.
- Significant achievements, both in and out of school, are mentioned regularly in the school newsletters or on the Achievement Board.
- One child per class per term is sent a 'Well Done' postcard to their home.

# Home School Agreement

Each year all parents are asked to read, agree and sign a Home School Agreement to ensure effective partnership and trust between home and school.

#### School rules

- We do what the grown-ups ask us the first time.
- We keep our hands and our feet to ourselves.
- We do not cross the yellow line (without asking a grown up).
- We look after the things that belong to us and to others.
- We are polite and respect everyone.



# Equality

We work hard to ensure equality for our children, staff and other members of the school community. All children are special... they develop skills at different speeds for a variety of reasons and, like us, have strengths and weaknesses. Some children may need the opportunity to extend their learning while others may need support in certain areas. We believe it is very important that all children are given the opportunity to succeed and that any problems are identified quickly so that appropriate help can be given.

#### Special Needs

Through working with parents as partners and by continually tracking prgogress, we are able to adjust support to meet the child's needs at all times. We also hope that parents will feel able to take an active part in helping their children at home. When appropriate, we also involve outside agencies for theor expertise.

# Children working at a greater depth

We recognise that all children have their own gifts and talents. With that in mind, our lessons are stimulating and we provide regular opportunities for children to extend their learning and develop their special skills.

# How is my child doing?

A record of academic and social achievements is begun as children join Westmeads Community Infant School. These records begin in Reception and are added to throughout the children's time at Westmeads. The record is a three-way communication where the child, home and school comment and share special achievements. Added to this the teachers write a more detailed annual report covering all areas of the curriculum.

We also offer Parent Conversations three times a year where parents/carers can come and talk to the class teacher and discuss their child's progress. Throughout the year we invite parents to informally come into class to Family Parent/Child Work Share where children can share their learning with them.

#### **National Assessments**

In Year 1 children will take part in a national phonics screening check. The children are shown a number of real and made up words that draw upon their phonic (ability to hear, recall and use sounds) knowledge. Parents/ carers will be informed whether their child has met the required standard on their annual report.

will participate in Standard Assessment Tests (SATs) in reading, writing and maths. The results from these are used to support the end of Key Stage 1 teacher assessments. More information is given to parents regarding the SATs during the summer term in Year 2. Please be reassured that these are carried out in a sensitive manner suitable to the age of the children and should not give children or parents any concerns. If you have any questions regarding assessment, please talk to your child's teacher or Mrs Gowing or Mrs Lambirth.

# Sport and music



# Sport

We give the children the opportunity to experience a wide range of curriculum P.E. beginning with our 'Wake up, shake up!' routines every morning at 9 o'clock and our daily gentle touch/yoga/mindfulness sessions after lunch. In P.E. lessons, the children experience tri-golf, dodgeball, indoor curling, volleyball and kwik cricket in addition to more traditional sports like tag rugby, football and hockey. Our playground trim trail area encourages the children to balance, climb and co-ordinate their bodies.

#### Sports Clubs

In addition to the sports clubs run by staff, we offer children the opportunity to attend clubs run by specialist sports coaches. We currently have links with Appeti tennis, Football Futures, Street Dance and Premier Sport who offer fencing, archery and a range of other sports.



# Music

Music is an important part of school life. We often find it easier to learn through songs, sounds and rhythms and music forms an integral part of school assemblies.

We are lucky that all children have the chance to work with our peripatetic music teacher to learn about rhythm, pitch and musical composition and appreciation. In Year 2, everyone learns to play the recorder, performing a concert to parents at Eastertime. In addition, we are able to offer private music lessons in ukulele and violin.

Westmeads also has a small but dynamic children's choir who meet each week and perform on special occasions.

# **Admission into Reception**

The majority of children are admitted to our school in September of the academic year in which they are going to be aged five. This wil be birthdays between 1st September and 31st August. We currently admit 60 children per year into our school. All admissions, including mid-year pupil moves, are dealt with by a common application form submitted to the local authority.

#### Can I visit the school before I apply?

Yes, we want to meet you and your child/ children! Around October each year we organise tours for you to come and see the school, meet the Headteacher, staff and children. Tour dates are displayed on our website but please call us to book a place as we want you to have lots of time and opportunity to make the most of your visit so we limit places on each tour.

#### 3+ Club

You can come along to our 3+ Club if you have a child aged 3 and over (younger siblings are also welcome). The club runs on Wednesdays from 1.45-2.45pm from Term 3 (January). You will be given the opportunity to meet staff at the school who are on hand to answer questions regarding starting school. A member of our well-being team reads to your children in the Family Room to give you an opportunity to meet other parents and carers over a cup of tea or coffee.

#### **Transition**

Our successful transition programme of introductory talks and visits starts from June allowing both child and carer to build up trusting relationships with our staff. This ensures that children and parents/carers look forward to their first day at Westmeads Community Infant School.

#### New parents/carers meeting

In June, once all school places are confirmed, we hold an evening new parents/carers meeting' when we introduce ourselves and the organisation for your child starting school. During June and July we invite the children to spend some afternoons in their new classroom. Once they are settled, we invite parents/carers to stay for a cup of tea and a chat.

# Starting Westmeads at other times during the year

Before children can be admitted midyear, parents/carers and their children are encouraged to visit the school. An "In-year Casual Application Form" is given along with advice on how to complete it. Once completed it needs to be returned to school who will respond within ten school days. Should a place not be available, you will be offered a place for your child on our waiting list.

## **Applications**

Kent County Council Admissions Team processes all school applications:

- Kent residents should apply online using the link at www.kent.gov.uk/schooladmissions.
- If you are unable to make an online application, paper forms are available on special request from the Admissions Team.
- The closing date for September applications is in mid January of that year.
- You will be notified of your child's placement the following April.
- Our school has no say in how places are allocated. However there is an appeals process which parents can access.
