Mira and her new friend James are looking at storybooks in our cosy reading area.


We also have lots of exciting things outside for you to try, including a large sand pit, tricycles and scooters.

What happens at the end of the school day?




When school is finished for the day, you will all sit together on the carpet to listen to a story. You will also talk about the fun things you have been doing and learning during the day.
