What will I do in nursery?




You will do lots of fun activities in nursery. Amir is painting with blocks. "Look at my painting," he says.

You will soon make friends with the other children as you play.

Mei and Tim are reading together. "I love to read books," says Tim. "I can choose what I want to read from the bookshelf."

In nursery you will have phonics lessons, where you learn to recognise words and letters by their sounds. You will also have maths, dancing on the carpet and 'group time'.





What happens when I am hungry or thirsty?

If you are thirsty during the day, you can have some water. You will also have a healthy snack time, where you will be given fruit and milk or water. Before you have your snack, you will wash your hands.



If you are staying for lunch, you will have a packed lunch in the classroom.



What happens when I need to go to the toilet?

You can go to the toilet whenever you need to. You can ask an adult if you want help or if you have any problems.

The toilets are near the classroom. They are very easy to find and everything is just the right size for children.

Amir is washing his hands to make sure they are clean and to stop germs from spreading.

"I love the bubbly soap," says Amir.

Amir practised going to the toilet at home, wearing his uniform, so he would know what to do in nursery.
