You will hang your coat and bag on a peg with your name and a picture of your classroom animal on it, just like Jack, Emily and Nadim are doing.

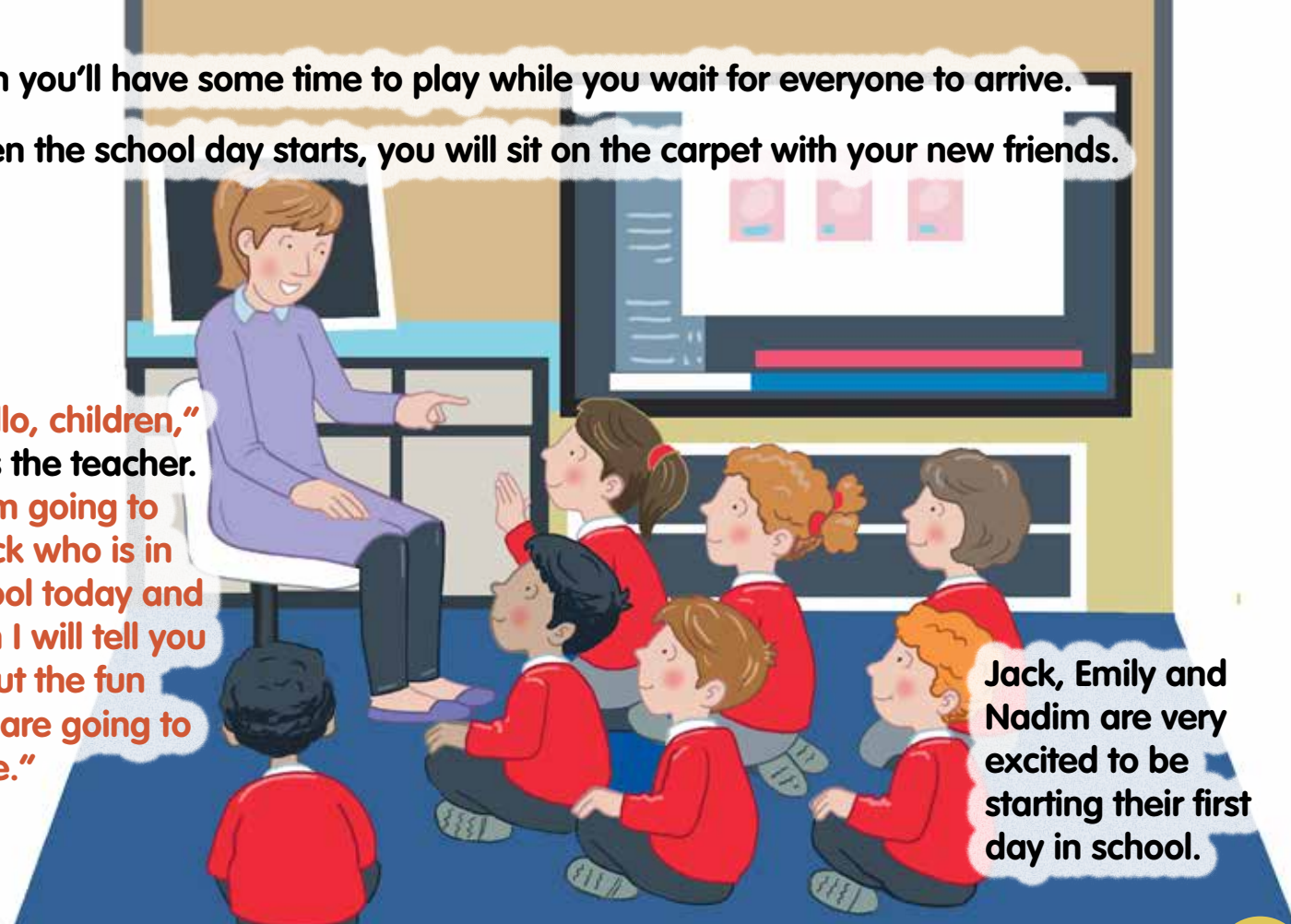


Lunch boxes will go on the shelf under the peg and water bottles will go into the water bottle box.

What if I am hungry or thirsty?

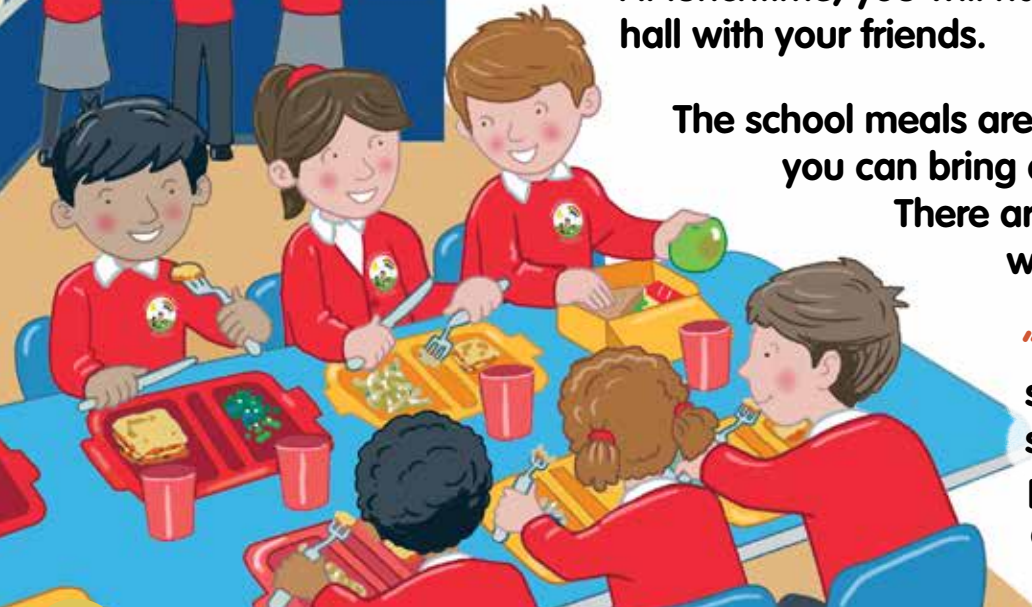


In the morning, you can help yourself to a fruit snack to eat at your table and water whenever you are thirsty.
