You will come to school looking very smart in your uniform.


Your grown-up will bring you to the school gate, where you will say goodbye to them.

"It's important to flush the toilet after I have been, so it's nice and clean for the next person," says Haris.





When you have been to the toilet, wash your hands with soap and water and dry them well so they are clean and germ-free.

Haris is so happy that he practised going to the toilet on his own at home, so he knows what to do at school.

"I'm glad I practised going to the toilet by myself. Now I don't need any help!" says Haris.

If you have a toilet accident or hurt yourself when you are playing, tell a teacher and they will help. If you have hurt yourself, your teacher will take you to a first-aider and they will look after you.
