

Danny, Ahmed and Charlotte love coming to Hazelmere Infant School and Nursery



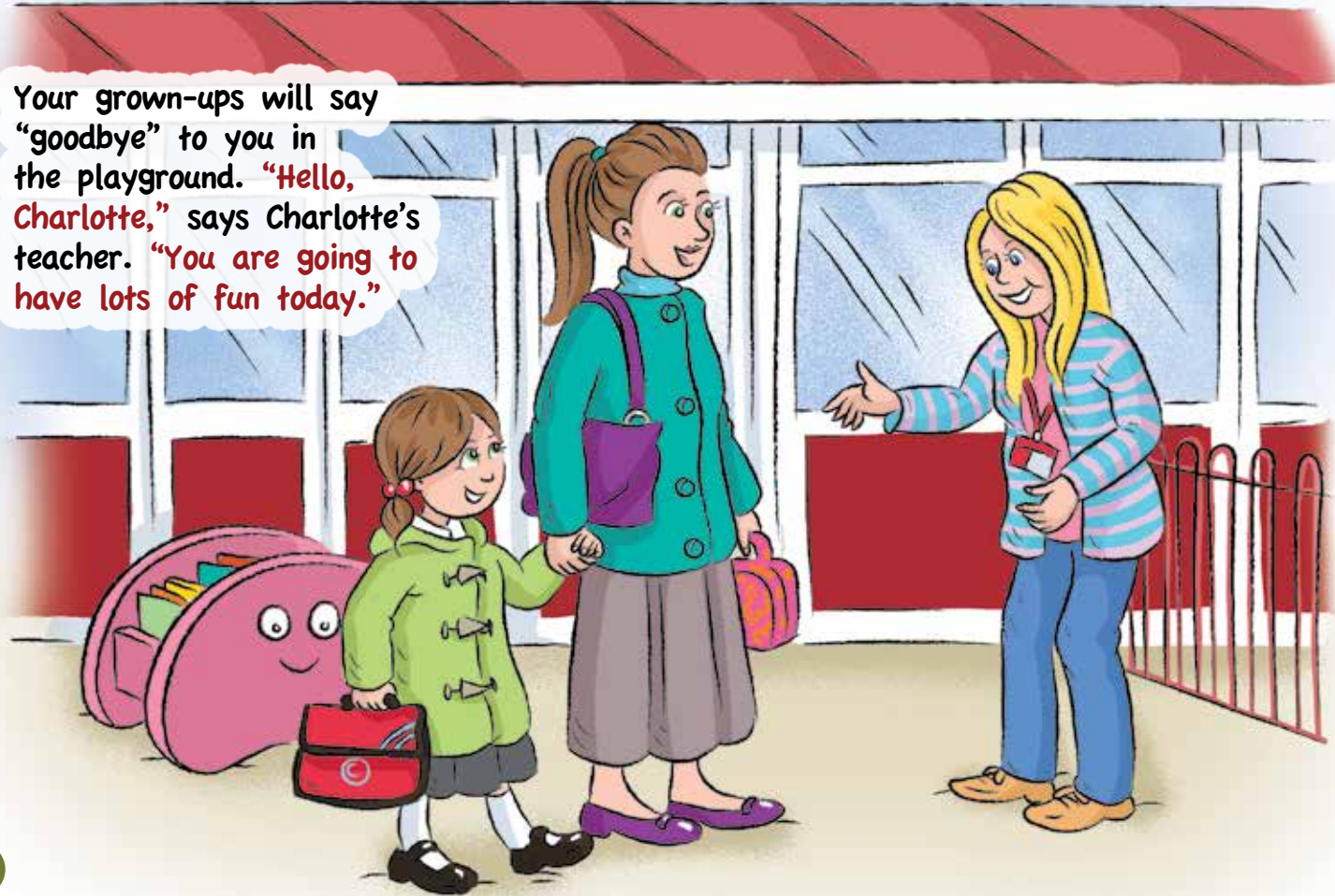
These are the words to think about when you attend our school and nursery:

What happens when I get to school?

Your grown-ups will say "goodbye" to you in the playground. "Hello, **Charlotte,**" says Charlotte's teacher. "You are going to have lots of fun today."



You will wash your hands, hang up your coat on a coat peg that has your name on it, and put your book bag in a box. Charlotte feels very grown-up hanging up her coat.



You will also bring a change of clothes and a pair of wellies. If it is hot, you will need a sun hat, and in winter, a hat, scarf and gloves. They need to have your name on in case you lose them.



Once in the classroom, you will start playing with your friends. There could be puzzles or 'messy play' activities.

What are your favourite games?

What happens if I need the toilet?

You can go to the toilet whenever you want to. If you are doing an activity with your teacher, just put your hand up to let them know.

The toilets are in the classroom, and everything is just the right size for children.

What happens at the end of the school day?

When school is ending for the day, you will sit on the carpet and listen to a story. Your teacher will use the Tapestry Learning Journal to share what you have been doing at home and at school.

You will then collect your belongings and sit back on the carpet.



Your grown-ups will wait outside. Your teacher will go to the door and call you when they see your grown-ups.

"I've had a lovely time at school," says Charlotte to her grown-up. **"I can't wait to tell you what I've been doing."**

At home, your grown-ups can look at the Tapestry Learning Journal to see what you have been doing in school. They can also upload photos and videos of what you are doing at home, to show your teacher.
