What happens when I get to school?

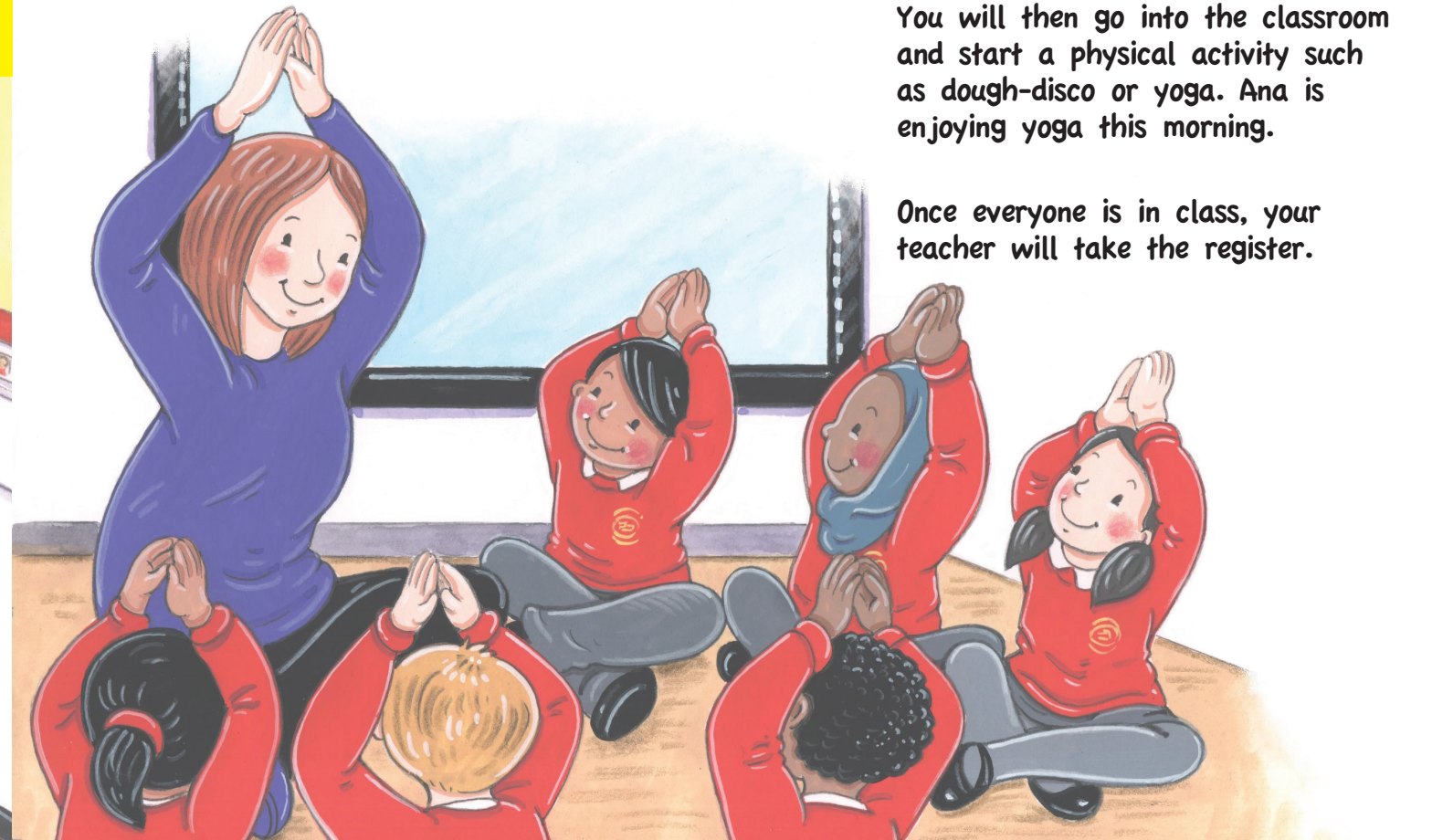
Your grown-ups will bring you to the classroom door. Your teacher will welcome you in.

What happens if I need the toilet?

On your first day in school, your teacher will take you to the toilet to show you how everything works, and remind you about flushing the toilet and washing hands.

You can go to the toilet whenever you want to.



Zaki has put his hand up to tell the teacher he's going to the toilet. He feels very grown-up going to the toilet on his own. You only need to tell your teacher if you are doing an activity with them.



Zaki practised at home, while wearing his uniform, so he knew what to do in school.

If you have an accident, don't worry. Just let your teacher know and they will help you.

After flushing, Zaki is very careful to wash his hands. "I don't want to spread any germs," he says to himself.



Are you going to practise at home like Zaki?

What happens if I am hungry or thirsty?

If you are hungry or thirsty during the day, you can visit the comfy snack area and help yourself. There are cushions to lie back on.

In the morning, you can have fruit and bagels. There is also milk and water.

Zaki is enjoying his bagel. "It's super tasty," he says.



At lunchtime, you will go into the hall with your teacher who will help you collect your tray and meal.

You can choose what you would like to have. Our menus are on our website and a grown-up at home can show you what healthy food there is on the menu.



Each class has its own lunchtime supervisor who you will get to know very well. When Ana started school, she had trouble using cutlery and the lunchtime supervisor helped her.

After lunch, you will play in the Outdoor Area.

Towards the end of the day, you will sit on the carpet and listen to a story.

You will then collect your coat and book bag and sit back on the carpet.



When it is home time, your grown-up will wait outside at the gate. Your teacher will go to the door and call you when they see your grown-up.

Hodan is excited to tell her grown-up about the brilliant time she's had at school. "I've had lots of fun today at school," she says.

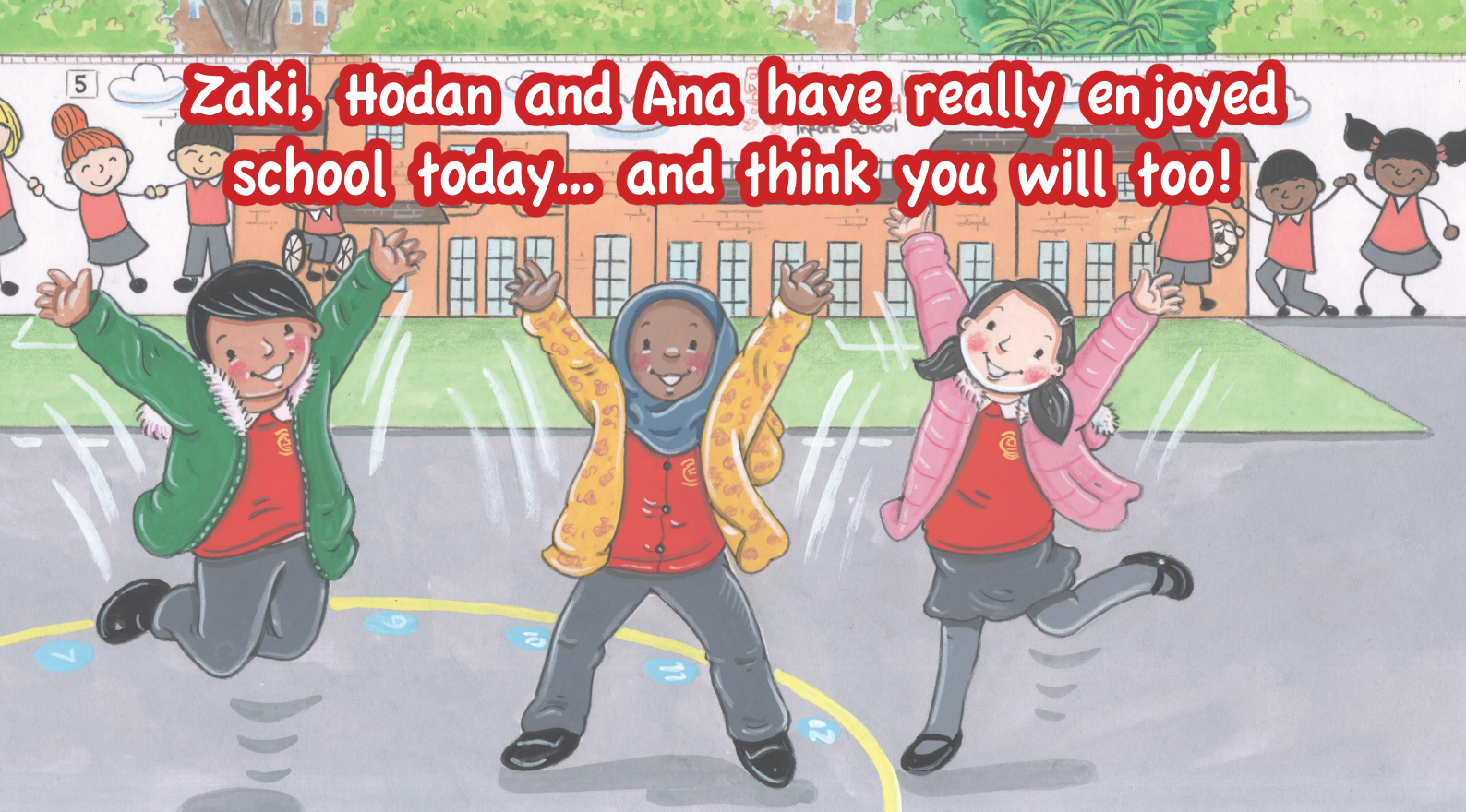
Your grown-ups can look online on the Tapestry Learning Journal to see what you have been doing at school. They can also upload photos and videos to show your teacher what you do out of school.
