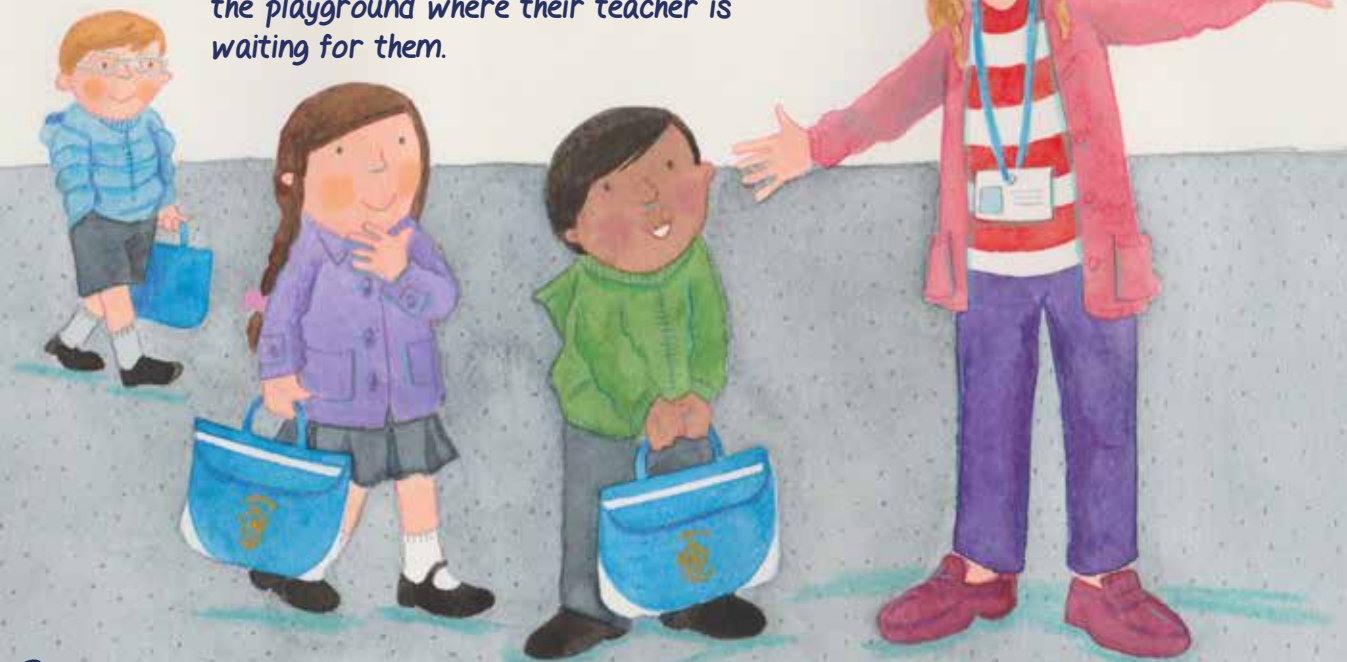

What happens when I get to school?

During the morning, you will have a snack of fresh fruit to eat, and water or milk to drink. Fruit is delicious and your teacher will encourage you to eat some each day.



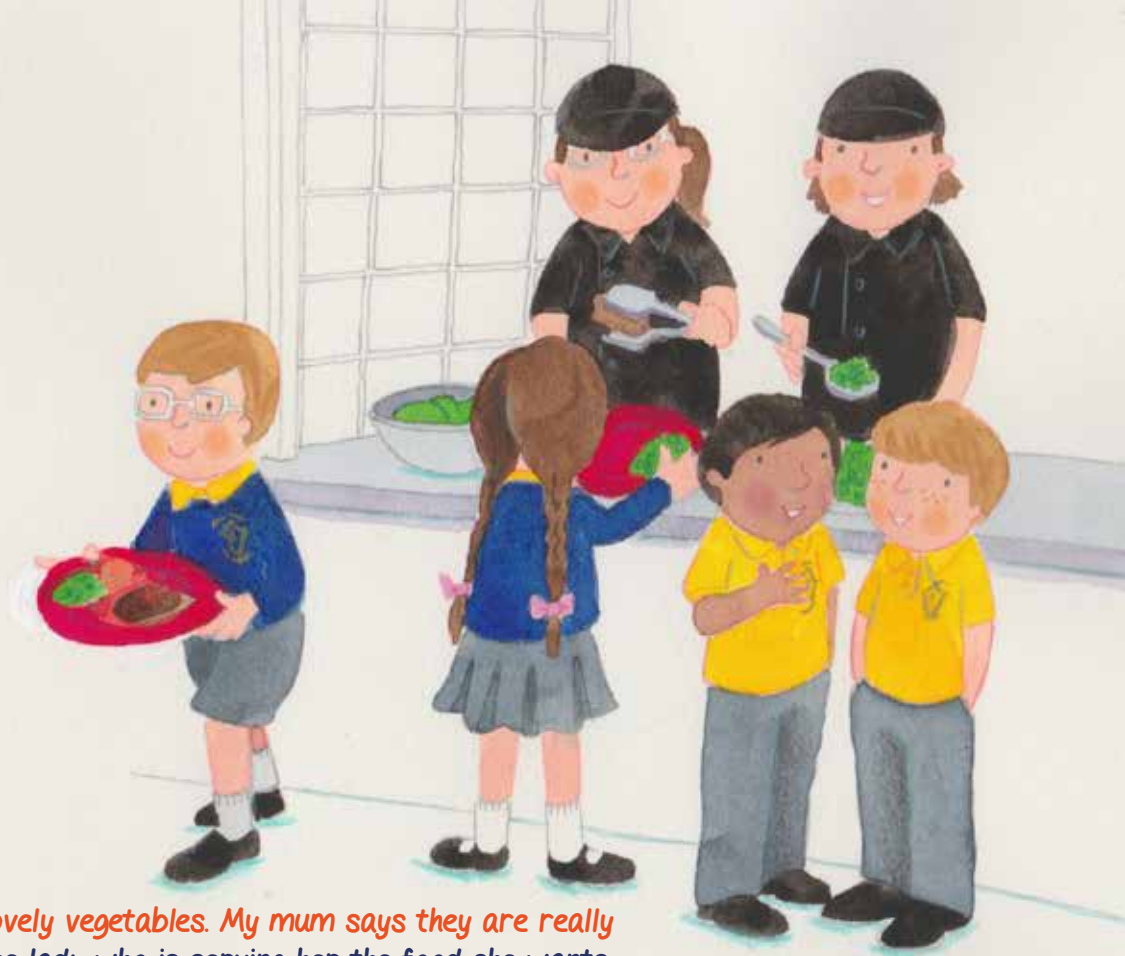
Mustafa, Millie and Harry are sitting chatting with their new friend, Jack as they enjoy their morning snack.
