


## What happens when I come to school?

Your grown-ups will make sure that you get up early enough so you can get ready and arrive at school on time. It is important to have breakfast every morning so you have lots of energy for school.


When you come to school, your grown-ups will bring you to the classroom door and say "goodbye". Your teacher will be waiting there to say "hello" and take you into school.

At lunchtime, you will wash your hands and line up. Then your teacher will take you to Ash Class for lunch.

You will collect your meal from the kind lunchtime staff at the serving table. Then, you will sit at a table with your friends.

"This is so tasty," says Purity, before she chomps on the last carrot. Everyone is going to eat all of their lunch.

You will use a knife, fork, spoon and cup by yourself and say "please" and "thank you".

If you need help, there will always be kind lunchtime staff looking after you.

## What happens when I need the toilet?



You can go when you want to and you don't have to wait for breaktimes. You just need to ask your teacher if you can leave your classroom. Your teacher will give you a band to wear to show you are going to the toilets.

You will walk to the toilet with another child but if you have an accident or need help, you can tell your teacher and they will help. Your grown-ups can leave some spare clothes for you at school in case of accidents.

"Don't forget to wash your hands."

Tom has remembered to flush and now he is washing his hands with soap and water and will dry them.

"I am going to make sure my hands are squeaky clean," he says. "Clean hands help stop germs spreading."

You will dry your hands with a nice and quiet hand dryer.

It is much quieter than a normal hand dryer but your grown-ups can help you get used to using one before you come to school.
