


Ishaan, Millie and Sam are on their visit to Ashfield school to find out what it will be like when they start coming here.

## What will I do at Ashfield?


There are lots of new and exciting things to learn and do at Ashfield. You can even join the School Council.


## How will I get on with older children?




Sometimes children worry about mixing with older children in Junior school.

Millie's buddy is helping her learn about gardening.






Now Ishaan, Millie and Sam have lots of friends in the playground and they love trying out all the 'huff and puff' equipment.
