


What happens when I get to school?

James is teaching Hassan the games they play outside. They are running across the field as they push their hoops along.


"You can run very fast, Hassan," says James. "I can hardly keep up with you."




Then they sit and chat on the bench. James is telling Hassan that they will have a chance to play and read together regularly. Hassan is really pleased to have such a caring buddy.

Hassan and Pippy are learning about computer coding on the computers in our ICT suite.




What is your favourite subject at school?

That is how we learn.


Hassan is writing a little story about his favourite Superhero and his teacher helps him with the longer words he wants to use but is not sure how to spell.

Alex, Pippy and Hassan are in the school Nativity play and they are practising their lines.


"I hope I don't forget anything in the service," says Alex.


"You have worked really hard, Alex," says Hassan.
