


How should I get ready for my first day?

Welcome to your journey with Alsager School.

You will need to bring the following items with you in a strong school bag:

- 2 black pens
- 1 green pen
- 2 pencils
- Ruler
- Rubber
- Calculator

We will give you your student planner when you join us and you will need to make sure you bring it to school every day.

To make sure you don't forget anything, it is a good idea to pack your school bag the night before.



Please remember that you cannot use phones or smart watches in school. If you have to use one for your journey to and from school, it must be switched off and put away whilst in school.

What happens on my first day at Alsager School?

Your new term will start earlier than the rest of the school so you can get settled in when the school is less busy.

You may know some students from your primary school but don't worry if you don't. On your first day, you will do lots of fun activities, which will help 'break the ice' and help you start to make new friends.

Your Form Tutor will give you a timetable and map of the school. Don't worry about getting lost – all staff and other students will be happy to help you.

By the end of the first week, you will find that you know the school very well.



When you start at Alsager, you will join one of our colleges: Dod, Lovell, Moreton or Royce.









On your first day, you will meet your Head of College, who will work with your Form Tutor to make sure you settle into school life. Together they will help you with any problems you have, inside and outside school.

We all know what the first day in secondary school feels like, so we will do as much as possible to make you feel welcome and help you settle in.



What happens in a school day?

The school day has five lessons, which are 60 minutes long. There is also a break and lunchtime.

08.30	Arrive at school

09.45 – 10.45	Period 2
10.45 – 11.05	Break
11.05 – 12.05	Period 3
12.05 – 12.30	Form time
12.30 – 13.05	Lunch
13.05 – 14.10	Period 4
14.10 – 15.10	Period 5

You will move between classrooms for different lessons. Everyone will be happy to help, so just ask an older student or a teacher if you get lost.

You will learn new subjects, as well as building on what you have learnt before in subjects you have studied at primary school.

The school canteen 'Best Bite' is open before school, as well as at break and lunchtime. It has a brilliant selection of food for you to enjoy, from snacks to full meals.
