


WHAT WILL I NEED FOR MY FIRST DAY?

Ground rules


The following ground rules are displayed in every classroom and are printed in the student planner. They supplement the code of conduct and lay down the basic requirements for students' behaviour on entering, during and on leaving lessons.



At the beginning and during lessons or registration

- **1.** Students enter the room with the teacher's permission.
- On entering, students remove topcoats, sit down an get out the equipment needed for the lesson and begin to consider the learning intention written on the board.
- **3.** The teacher decides where students sit and may vary this from lesson to lesson.
- **4.** Courtesy students will not talk when the teacher is talking to the whole class.
- **5.** Courtesy students will not talk when another student is talking to the teacher and the whole class.

- **6.** Consideration students will not distract others from working or interrupt when the teacher is working with a small group.
- **7.** If a student needs help or advice at any stage, they will raise their hand and wait quietly until the teacher is able to deal with them.
- **8.** At the end of a lesson, students will quietly follow the teacher's instructions for dismissal.
- **9.** While moving to another lesson or lunch, students will move quietly and without fuss.
- **10.** Respect and tolerance students will support each other's learning and the teacher by always following these ground rules.



SCHOOL TRANSPORT


The school buses depart from the Turning Circle, and staff will be on hand to ensure you board the correct bus. You will never be left behind.


Asking for help

FARM AND FARM SHOP

Brockhill Farm

Brockhill Park is very lucky to have a working farm on its beautiful site.

You will find cattle, sheep, pigs, chickens, and small animals on our farm. All our farmyard animals are reared for meat that is sold in our Farm Shop next to the walled garden.

Great Outdoors lessons

Every student in Years 7 and 8 has a Great Outdoors lesson every week. In Year 7, you will learn about healthy eating and food miles, and take part in activities including the lambing year, riding our smoothie bike and omelette making.

Young Farmers' club

Our Young Farmers' club meets weekly on our farm to learn about animal welfare, husbandry and show technique. Every year we show our animals at the Kent County Show in July, and the Ashford Fatstock Show in December. The club also runs public events, including Open Farm Sunday in the Spring and Carols with the Animals at Christmas.
