School uniform


You should wear your Cardinal Pole Catholic School uniform with pride and always come to school dressed in the correct uniform.

What if I need help?


The Pastoral Team, which includes the Head of Year, Pastoral Support Manager and Year 7 Form Tutors, will support your learning and wellbeing.
