



We understand that coming to secondary school is a big step and that you may be feeling both excited and nervous right now. We want to do as much as we can to help make your transition to CoDA as smooth as possible, and so that you know what to expect when you arrive.

Before you start with us in September, you will have our Common Transfer Days. These are three transition days where you will get the opportunity to come to CoDA to meet the staff, tour the school and take part in a number of learning experiences. This will really help you prepare for the move to secondary school.

If you feel you will also need some additional support with your transition to us, we can arrange some further intervention days. Just ask your parents/carers to let us know.

How should I prepare for my first day?

We have high expectations of uniform and presentation at CoDA.

We will give you a free blazer during your transition visits. You will also be given a free tie when you arrive in September.

You will also need your PE kit.

We will provide your parents/carers with a full uniform list and you can also get more information on our uniform guidelines, and where to order it, on our website.

You will need the following equipment in a suitable bag for carrying A4 books and equipment: black/blue pens, pencils, ruler, rubber, pencil sharpener and calculator.

We will provide you with your school passport and any other equipment that you may need.

Make sure that everything has your name on it, including your uniform, so things can be returned to you easily if they are mislaid.



Before your first day, plan your route to school, and make sure you leave plenty of time for your journey.

When you arrive at school, you will enter by the main pedestrian gate and walk down the drive and into the school yard. You will then enter the school building via the main doors, under the 'Welcome to CoDA' sign.

Don't worry. We will will clearly signpost where you need to go and there will be plenty of staff around to meet and help you.

You will meet your Form Tutor, if you haven't already, and you will receive your school passport and timetable.



What does the school day look like?

You will move between classrooms for different lessons. You will study new subjects and build on what you have learnt in subjects you have studied before.

At CoDA, we use Class Charts to keep track of your achievements and behaviour.

You will receive points for good behaviour and will have points taken away for not meeting expectations.

You will be able to use your points to buy rewards from our Reward store.

We believe in rewarding pupils and celebrating in their successes, so we will add 18 positive reward points daily for every pupil, if they meet the 3R expectations.

We have a wide variety of clubs, activities and trips that you can take part in.


Our clubs are a great way to make new friends, have fun and develop lots of new skills. They take place before school, at lunchtimes and after school.
