


How should I get ready for my first day?

Pencil.


Ruler.

- ...and a dictionary (not essential but useful).


It is a good idea to pack your bag the night before, so you have everything you need and don't forget anything when you are in a rush in the morning.



Who can I speak to if I am worried about anything?

We want you to feel happy and secure at school.

We all have worries from time to time though, and it really helps to talk to someone.



What if I need extra help?

We have a brilliant facility called the Student Support Centre. Everyone can use the Student Support Centre. It is open most of the day. You can meet friends, do homework, or speak to staff.

We also hold breakfast club there. You can have a free bagel and drink... and catch up with friends before lessons start.

If you need extra help with anything, you may receive one-to-one help from a teacher or work in small groups in the Student Support Centre. We can help you if you have been away from school for a while or need extra help away from the classroom.

If you need to take medication during the day, we will look after it at the centre and you can go there to take it.

If your parents or carers need advice or support, they can also contact the centre.



What happens in a school day?

You can come into school for breakfast from 8.20am (but no earlier). You should be at school by 8.50am at the latest so you are ready for form time at 8.55am. There are five lessons of an hour each, with break and lunchtime. Lessons finish at 3.20pm and clubs run until 4pm.
