We will provide you with a blazer, tie and full PE kit before you join us.


We have high standards for everything at Dean Trust Rose Bridge, which includes our uniform.


What happens on my first day at Dean Trust Rose Bridge?

Rewards range from points, badges, certificates and vouchers to trips and events away from school, such as cinema trips.


We have an Awards Evening each year to celebrate fantastic progress, attainment and conduct. It should be your goal to win an award at this event and we hope to see you and your family there next year!
