
# How should I get ready for my first day?

## We follow the ARCH values:

#### Aspire:

Be ambitious. Set no limits to your ambitions. Believe in yourself. Work as a team to help each other succeed. Never give up.

#### Respect:

Arrive on time and ready to learn every day. Respect your teacher and class mates by listening in lessons and behaving well. Wear your uniform correctly and with pride.

### Community:

Be kind and use respectful language. Move around the school safely and respect property. Show that you care for your local and wider community.

#### Hard Work:

Put time and effort into everything you do. Take failure in your stride and learn from it. Take responsibility for your own learning and improvement. Take on challenges in a positive way.

We believe in rewarding you when you have done well rather than taking sanctions when you haven't.

We will give you Commitment to Progress points for every lesson. You will receive more detailed information about this when you join us.

We want ALL of you to achieve a 1 or 2 in every lesson and tutor time.

You will receive house points for demonstrating ARCH values and we reward you according to points earned. Remember to keep your planner with you all the time and have it on your desk during lessons and tutor time so that your teacher can update it with any points you earn.

Although we prefer to not resort to sanctions, we have clear boundaries and a system of penalties which we will let know you about when you join Year 7.
