If your parents/carers are concerned about anything that may have an impact on your schoolwork, they can also contact your Depute or Pupil Support Teacher.

The Deputes or Pupil Support Staff can be contacted by letter, telephone or email.




How should I prepare for my first day?

On your first day, make sure you are wearing the correct uniform, you have all the equipment you will need and you get to school on time.

We will give your parents/ carers a full list of the uniform and equipment you will need. Please make sure you are wearing it correctly.

You can also wear a plain black V-neck jumper or cardigan which allows the school tie to be seen.





What equipment do I need to bring with me?



You will need pens, pencils, a rubber, a ruler, a calculator, a water bottle and a backpack to keep it all in. Always pack your bag the night before so you aren't in a rush and don't forget anything.

You will also need your PE kit if you have PE on the first day. The kit consists of a navy PE polo shirt, black shorts, plain track bottoms for outdoor lessons and non-mark-sole trainers.

What else do I need to think about?

Getting to school:

Check your route well before your first day so you know where to go and how long it will take. Check bus or train times as well. If you live more than two miles from school, you can apply for a free bus pass. Food:

You can bring a packed lunch or use the canteen. We will give you a PIN number for the cashless catering system which you type into one of the top-up machines. Add your money, then you're good to go. Your parents/carers can add money to your account using their Parent Pay account. The canteen has a great range of delicious food that caters for every taste.

What does the school day look like?

Like all Invercive schools. Monday and Tuesday are longer days with a seven period day finishing at 3.45 p.m. Wednesday, Thursday and Friday are shorter days and finish at 2.55 p.m.

What will I study?

You will study a wide range of subjects: Art and Design, Drama, Music, PE, Health and Wellbeing, English, Literacy, French, Spanish, Religious and Moral Education, Mathematics and Numeracy, Science, ICT including Admin, Computing and Business, Design Technology including Design and Manufacture and Graphics, Geography, History, Modern Studies, ICT and Technical.

You will move between classrooms for different subjects. During the first few days at school, you will be guided to and from classes and have a little extra time to move from one to the other.

What about homework?

You can track your home learning using the 'Show My Homework' app. You will get reminders of home learning tasks in class, but the app will also give you a notification when a task is set and when it's due. Your parents/carers will also get a reminder.



How can I get more involved?

We have a 'Pupil Parliament' where pupils can help make decisions about how the school is run as well as getting involved with local community and global issues. The pupils also run pupil drop-in centres to listen to pupil concerns. They can present their ideas to the school's Head Teacher and Senior Leadership Team. You can get involved right from S1. You also get involved with the local community. including fundraising and volunteering in our associated primaries, in care homes and in local nurseries.
