Attitude towards learning

We want all lessons to have an atmosphere where you can learn free of distractions and feel able to do your best. We also want everyone to feel safe and happy anywhere in the Academy so we have high expectations for behaviour at all times.

We will want you to always be:

- **Ready** – Prepared for your lessons and eager to learn
- **Respectful** – Showing respect for your teachers and other staff at the Academy, for other students and for yourself
- **Calm** – Reacting calmly and showing resilience when you are facing challenges

Rewards

We believe in promoting good behaviour and attitudes so we have a system of rewards to recognise students who have shown a **'Ready, Respectful, Calm'** approach in their lives.

You can collect points which earn you badges, certificates, discounts on year-end trips and vouchers! We will also ring your parents/carers to let them know how well you are doing.

What if I need help?

You can speak to any teacher but the best person to speak to will be your Form Tutor. We also have a Pastoral Team, led by Miss Liaqat, who are always there to help you.



What will I need for my first day?



You will also need to bring your PE kit when it is on your timetable.

We will provide your parents/carers with a comprehensive list of what is needed and where to get it.

You will also need to bring the following items of equipment:

- School bag
- Pen
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Rubber
- Sharpener
- Geometrical equipment
- Coloured pencil crayons
- Reading book
- Scientific calculator

We will also give you your timetable and planner on your first day.

Remember to switch off and put any electronic devices away when you are on school premises.



What happens on my first day?

Everyone here remembers what the first day in secondary school feels like. We know you may be feeling excited and nervous and you may be wondering if you are ever going to feel at home. So we will do as much as possible to make you feel welcome and help you settle in.

On your first day, you will be greeted by your Head of Year, your Form Tutor and some of the Transition Buddies, and you will then go to your new form room.

You will take part in a range of activities and will receive a copy of your timetable, planner and a copy of the Academy map, to help you locate the different classrooms. You will also attend your first assembly, before you go to your first timetabled lesson.

Friends

You may be worrying about making new friends. Although you may know some pupils from your primary school, don't worry if you don't. Be brave and introduce yourself to some girls that you don't know already. You will soon make new friends.

By the end of the first week, you will find that you know KEVI very well.



What does a typical school day look like?

Each day, you will have six lessons and a morning and lunch break.

You will move between classes for lessons. You will soon find your way around but you can ask anyone for help if you get lost.

Food

We have a brilliant canteen where you can choose anything from snacks such as sandwiches and paninis to salads, pizza and even roast dinners.

Your parents/carers will pay into an online account for you, so you don't need to bring in any cash. In September, you will get an ID card and a card with a large QR code on. The two cards fit into one card holder. You will use the QR code to pay for food in the canteen. The card is linked to your Parent Pay account.



What will I study?

You will study a broad range of subjects. Some you will be familiar with from primary school and some may be completely new to you.

Subjects studied in Year 7 include:

Art Classics Drama

DT English French Geography

History ICT Mathematics

Modern Foreign Languages Music

PE PSHE RE Science Textiles

Your teachers will be experts in their subjects and teach you in a variety of interesting ways.

Home study

You will also be set regular home study. You will be expected to write down what you have to do in your planner. You will need to make time to complete it so that it is done to your best standard and on time.

This will be a big change from primary school, so plan out your time out of school to make sure you can fit in home study and any other commitments you have, such as hobbies.



What extra-curricular activities can I take part in?

Life at KEVI is about so much more than what you study in your lessons.

We have a brilliant range of extra-curricular activities on offer.

There will be a breakfast club in the mornings and enrichment clubs that will take place during lunch or after school.

You can do sports such as **badminton, cricket, football** or **Sports Crew**, where you can try a wide range of sports.

You can explore other interests such as **chess, Anime, foreign films, book clubs, textiles, creative writing, cooking, foreign languages, card games, Pattern and Puzzle Society, crochet, dance, art** or our **Medicine club**, which is for girls who are interested in becoming vets, pharmacists, doctors, nurses or dentists.

We even have a wellbeing club where you can relax and do things such as colouring, reading and board games.

There is such a huge range of opportunities, so we know there will be something that you will love.

Extra-curricular activities also help you develop your character and get you ready for life after KEVI by developing essential skills. For example, they will help build confidence as you learn new skills. You will develop resilience and learn how to keep going when you have challenges – and lots more!
