


How should I get ready for my first day?

We are delighted to welcome you to City of London Academy Highbury Grove and have put together this booklet to help you feel confident and informed about what to expect when you arrive. We are looking forward to meeting you and working with you.

Starting Year 7 is a big step, so we do as much as possible to help you get off to a good start. Don't worry.

We expect high standards of presentation from your very first day, so you will need to make sure you are wearing the correct uniform. Our students are proud to wear their uniforms.





You will need to bring along a school bag, with the following:

- Three pens (black or blue and one green)
- Two pencils
- Sharpener and eraser
- Coloured pencils or felt pens
- Ruler
- Scientific calculator (Casio is the preferred choice)
- Geometry set for Mathematics
 Please don't bring any phones or smart watches into school. If they are needed for your journey to and from school, they should be handed into the office on arrival.

TOP TIPS

- To be ready for school, pack your bag the night before.
- For your first day at school, plan your route well beforehand... and try it out!



Everyone at the school knows what their first day in secondary school felt like, so they will do as much as possible to make new pupils feel welcome and help them settle in. Everyone will be friendly and welcoming.

Your first day will begin at 8.40am (gates will open at 8.20am) and finish at 3pm. It's important you are on time and arrive in the correct uniform at the student entrance on Highbury New Park. On this day you will get to experience the following:

- Meet your tutor: this is the person you will see every day and who will be a main point of contact for you and your family.
- Values: be introduced to our Academy values and what it means to be a Highbury Grove student.
- A tour of the Academy: you will visit the classrooms and departments where lots of your lessons will take place.

- Meet other students in Year 7: this is a chance to make friends and get to know other Year 7 students.
- Sit a short reading assessment: this is nothing to worry about but will help us know more about your strengths as a reader and if you might need a bit more help.

• Enrichment: learn about all the fantastic enrichment opportunities you can take part in.



What happens in a school day?

Every day there are five lessons which are 60 minutes long. There is also a break and lunchtime. Each day is different and there are lots of exciting things to do in lessons.

There are different classrooms for lessons. If you get lost, don't worry, just ask someone for directions. You will soon get used to finding your way round.

All students will be allocated to one of our four houses:




