

How should I get ready for my first day?

Starting secondary school is a big change. We know you will have lots of questions, so we have written this book to answer them and help you settle in quickly and confidently.

Travelling to school

Many of you will be travelling by bus to school. Well before your first day, make sure you have a bus pass or have sorted out how you are paying for your travel. Check your timetable and route so you know where to catch your bus and how long it takes.

Allow plenty of time for delays on the way so you arrive on time.

What do I need for my first day?

Uniform:

You should always wear the correct uniform. Remember, you are representing our school when you wear it. so always look smart.

Equipment:

Pack your bag the night before and check it against

your timetable so you don't forget anything!

You will also need to bring these items every day:

Pens, scientific calculator, pencils, pair of compasses, 30cm ruler, coloured pencils, rubber, glue stick, sharpener and protractor.

We will also give you a planner, which you will need to bring every day. You will keep it on your desk during lessons so you can update it.


