


Motivation, Commitment and Care





What do I wear to MCC?

You will need to wear the correct uniform from the first day.



What equipment do I need?

You will need a suitable bag which should contain:

- Snack/lunch if you are not buying lunch from the canteen

If you bring a mobile phone, you must have it switched off and in your bag. You only get your phone out under instructions of a member of staff

Learning The Minsthorpe Way

MCC is a place where we all play our part in strengthening our learning community through Motivation, Commitment and Care. All your teachers will follow 6 core principles in your lessons and it looks like this:

- 1. Prompt and purposeful start to every lesson, so you know what you are learning.
- 2. Retrieval activity to link your learning to what you have done in previous lessons.
- Teaching you new content, knowledge and skills (a focus on literacy and numeracy).
- 4. Show you what a good one looks like (WAGOLL).
- Allowing you the chance to work on your own to complete tasks and activities.
- 6. Review what you have covered to support your learning in the next lesson.



Your teachers will also help you build a range of skills that will help you be successful in the future. These include listening, speaking, problem-solving, being creative, aiming high, leadership, teamwork, and staying positive and resilient.

What happens in a college day?

The college day looks like this:

You may receive extra support in some key areas.
