Mental health and pastoral care

Pastoral care

Huntcliff has four houses, Apollo, Atlantis, Discovery and Endeavour. Each Year Group of students has their own Pastoral Support Officer. The Form Tutor takes an active role in monitoring the progress of the students, encouraging and supporting as required and communicating with parents/carers on a regular basis.

Respect, Reset, Resolve, Reflect

Our Respect, Reset, Resolve and Reflect policy (RRRR) is about promoting the positive attitudes, conduct and approaches our students bring to their learning, extracurricular activities and socialising around the school. RRRR develops students into academically successful young people of good character with a thirst for knowledge and a love of learning. Students who are also able to genuinely understand the impact of their behaviours and choices and know - when poor choices have been made - it is possible to review and make amends.

Joining our school: settling in

Transition

We have a dedicated Transition Lead to ensure that moving from a primary school setting to Huntcliff is as smooth as possible.

Preparing children

We arrange multiple visits by key staff to all year groups in primary schools, rather than just Year 6, so that children are well prepared for secondary school life.

Two-day transition event

There is also a two-day transition event to help build friendships, confidence and knowledge as well as sample our curriculum.

We also offer:

- Parents mornings.
- Year 6 welcome evening.
- Year 7 settling in evening.
- · Dedicated Year 7 form tutors.
- Regular contact with primary schools and parents.

Trips and Clubs

We have strong links to local clubs and We often have coaches from community clubs visiting us to lead taster sessions which we hope will then develop to students having the confidence to join clubs out of school.

There is a rotating programme of lunch and afterschool clubs that allow students to train for teams. We always listen to the student voice and provide opportunities that pupils ask for.

Previous trips include Man Utd stadium tour, watching premiership matches, netball tournaments in Spain, personal training sessions at local gyms and challenge days such as Go Ape.

Music

Our music department is an active and popular part of the school community. The subject gives students the tools and knowledge to go onto further education courses and musical careers.

Curriculum: building resilient learners

Wide range of subjects

At Huntcliff we have designed a curriculum that offers a wide range of subjects and experiences for our students. We offer all the core subjects plus:

- History
- French
- Life
- GeographyChildcare
- Performing Arts
- Food Technology
- Sports Science
- Art
- Textiles

All will achieve

We want all students to achieve, regardless of their starting points and we work hard to make sure they feel supported and championed. Students are also supported to achieve though academic and pastoral interventions when needed.

Bespoke support

We appreciate in these transitional times, some students will need bespoke interventions to support them either in closing gaps in knowledge or skills, or for their resilience and wellbeing, and we make sure the curriculum allows this support.

Global citizens

Academic achievement is important for pupils to move onto the next stage of their learning. However, we will always try and exploit opportunities for enrichment within lessons and allow time within the curriculum for educational visits and trips to further enrich students' learning experiences. We want to create successful global citizens who understand their responsibility to themselves and others, and this is supported through the delivery of Life in all year groups.

Implementation

A spiral curriculum allows content to be revisited and understanding assessed before new content added. This allows immediate interventions to take place throughout the students learning, so gaps in knowledge are minimised.

Social skills

Social skills of students are supported by teaching in a variety of ways including groups discussions, class talk and teamwork. Teachers know the importance of students having a broad and sophisticated vocabulary and recognise it is a way to promote success regardless of starting point, so the explicit teaching of vocabulary is evident in all curriculum areas.



Regular assessment will help students to progress

Lesson format is designed to be consistent but not constraining, so teachers can deliver content in a way they find appropriate for their groups. We introduce what we are learning today and share outcomes, there is an 'achieve outcome' we expect all students to get and an aspire outcome designed to challenge the more able. Within every lesson there is an opportunity to demonstrate understanding. This will be assessed by the teacher and tasks to intervene and improve given in the connect task at the start of the next lesson. This regular assessment allows teaching to be adapted swiftly and with impact where necessary

Promoting a love of reading

A love of reading is promoted through a variety of ways, for example timetabled library lessons and planned for Drop Everything and Read session.

KS3 students are part of the accelerated reader programme which support with not only reading but comprehension and vocabulary development. Students can also access our fully stocked library during lessons and social times; we have a dedicated librarian who runs events and session to support our young people with their thirst for reading.

Building resilient learners

Through the use of regular assessment and revisits, we aim to build resilient learners who know that to be their best they will need to review and redo work, and that this is not a failure.

Love of learning

We want to create a love of learning and allow students to find their talent through giving a range of experience and lesson content. We will provide personalised support for students who require it, with wellbeing classes and the Gateway provision. We will reward excellence and hard work so students leave us with strong character so throughout their lives have a positive and impact on society

There is the added bonus of the Student Leadership role being an extra string to their bow to add to CVs and college/ apprenticeship applications.


Prefects and the School Council

Clubs and Opportunities

Our extra-curricular clubs inspire students to make the best of their talents and to develop new ones. We know that students who leave Huntcliff having had a wide range of experiences will be better placed to have choices and have life chances. Our schools has a holistic approach and we know how important clubs and events are.

We offer a range of opportunities including science clubs, sports events, language clubs and performing arts shows.

We have regular visitors to the school that open our students mind beyond the school grounds. Visits from professionals inspire students to consider skills and jobs they may never have heard of, visits from authors and playwright develop creativity and visits from keyworkers such as doctors and paramedics can lead to students following these vital career paths.

Trips

We provide trips to the theatre and premier football, art and textiles visits to New York and art in Venice, netball and football trips to Europe, bowling and various reward visits.

Maths Challenge

The Maths Challenge is an opportunity to compete against other schools in maths problems and quizzes, and the Greenpower Car Competition allows students compete with others across the world to design, build and race an electric kit car.

Duke of Edinburgh

The Duke of Edinburgh Award allows students to access experiences and opportunities outside of the school walls. This is a national challenge for any student who wishes to participate, and it has proven to be very popular. Students from KS3 and 4 meet weekly to plan expeditions and community work in order to achieve Bronze, Silver and Gold awards. The award is a valuable addition to any university and future job application.



Preparation for life: pathways to the future

Careers advisor

Our dedicated Careers Advisor works closely with all students to make sure they are in a position to choose from a variety of future options, whether in higher education, apprenticeships or the workplace.

Links to colleges

We have close links and regularly visit with local colleges including taster days. Pupils have the chance to visit universities, and benefit from talks by industry experts and other professionals.

Careers education and quidance

Careers Education is provided through:

- Subject Lessons: information and discussions with a subject specific focus to help students make informed decisions about careers.
- Form, Assemblies and Life Lessons: discussions and resources about the local market information, growth job sectors. Post 16 and Post 18 options.
- Step Up Days: events such as employability days, virtual work

Information. Advice and Guidance is provided through:

- · Careers Cafes and Careers Fairs: employers, Colleges and Universities visit the school on a regular basic to talk about their industry and how to train and qualify for a role in that
- Careers Tile on Teams: students have access to an online careers tile on MS Teams which keeps them updated with careers related information, activities and events.
- · Results Service: a team of advisers to talk through exam results and help to explain options.

- Unifrog: online careers platform, designed to connect 11-18 year olds with their future career potential. Each pupil has a log on to access careers information and guidance, to build their own profile and explore job roles and employers. Their log on is valid up until they are 18 so can be transferred to college.
