


Helpful staff

Talented scientist Mahek is now trying to choose whether to study to become a doctor or to study to become a vet and she is planning to do voluntary work at both a hospital and a veterinary surgery after her GCSEs to help her decide. All religions are welcome at the school and all students are included. The school chaplain is very helpful and supportive of students who have any issues and will always make time to provide them with the emotional support they need. Students are actively encouraged to build positive relationships with teachers and other students and form time prayers and year group assemblies that take place every week remind us of the important values of service, compassion, forgiveness and truth."

Scientific discussions

"The staff have always been very helpful to me, and it was the Headteacher, Ms Langstaff, who encouraged me to set up a medical society. There are currently 11 members and we meet at lunch time once a week to discuss a variety of medical papers from scientific journals. Ms Langstaff recommended that I select articles from the British medical Journal and I try to pick ones that aren't too difficult for everyone to understand. We have had some interesting discussions about antibiotics and new vaccines, and we have discussed issues such as resistance to antibiotics and have tried to explore different ways of resolving this issue.

Obtaining work placements

Mahek says: "I am going to college next year to study for my A levels and then I plan to go on to university. I am going to have to decide whether I want to be a doctor or a vet, but the work placements that the school have helped to arrange at Warrington Hospital and at a local veterinary surgery, will really help me to make that decision.
