All out for success

"We spent a lot of time as a family at the school, attending sports events which Richard was organising," says Jackie, "so both the children felt completely at home there. Being very sporty they loved the emphasis Sandbach School places on a wide range of sports opportunities and Luke especially was impressed by the rugby and cricket facilities. Whilst other local schools also offer these, Sandbach School is the one which goes all out to give students the chance to play at such a high level, and in fact Luke has excelled at both, playing in the 1st XV Rugby team and

representing Cheshire Under 12's in cricket. It is most unlikely that he would have got this far were it not for the commitment of the school."

Credit where it is due

Georgia is also a gifted athlete and although she had done well academically at her own neighbouring school she decided to transfer to Sandbach School for her final sixth form year. "She was really pleased that Sandbach School had started to open the Sixth Form to girls," says Jackie. "She had taken several classes there in Year 12 and liked everything about it, including the sporting ethos, and we felt that as Luke had done so well there she should have the chance, too. Making the most of every opportunity

Both Georgia and Luke are fortunate enough to be able to combine academic achievement with their sporting interests and Jackie believes that it is largely because they are so taken with everything the school has to offer. "As well as sport, there are so many opportunities for those who want to grab them, and if a student shows an interest in the arts, for instance, they will be given every chance to make the most of it. The music and drama departments take groups to events all over the world, as does the PE department; Luke was able to play cricket in South Africa and plans to join the rugby tour to Canada next year."

Camaraderie

Jackie feels that it is the team spirit created, not just on the sports field but in the creative and performing arts, which makes a huge difference in how the students engage with their peers and with school life as a whole. "I have seen how boys who had been underachieving have absolutely flourished when they become part of a like-minded circle of friends, with shared interests and who are working together as a unit. There is a palpable camaraderie which impacts positively on every aspect of their education, and I think that Luke himself would have been a different person had he not been so effectively supported in every way."

A little bit of magic

According to Jackie, however much enthusiasm is shown by students and pupils, the teachers at Sandbach School give the same amount back, and more. Sandbach School not only looks a little like Hogwarts – it is working a bit of magic on its students as well!
