


ORGANISATIONAL SKILLS

"We are also pleased there is good discipline at St James'. If the children are late for school they will keep them in afterwards. Also, if they forget to take in their PE kit they will keep them in after school. Emily forgot to take it in once and she has learnt from the experience and always gets it ready the night before now. I think it encourages the children to be well organised.

"Emily always seems pleased to be going to school each day. She looks forward to seeing her friends, doing the work and likes the school dinners. She says she always eats everything on her plate. Emily now stays after school one day a week to have guitar lessons and she enjoyed going on a school trip to the RAF Museum when they were learning about World War Two.

CARING STAFF

"Although Emily lives only a short walk away from the school, some children have to catch a bus home. I like the fact that the staff are very supportive to the children and see them to the bus stop and watch them get on the bus safely in the afternoons," Neta says.

"We are glad Emily's younger sister, Erjona, is starting at St James' in September. She is looking forward to it and is not at all anxious and we are confident that she will be well looked after."

CHILDREN SAY

Emily says: "The teachers at St James' are very kind and are always there for you if you need anything.
