# Key information

## What are our school times?

8.40am - 3.15pm - EYFS and Key Stage 1  
8.40am - 3.30pm - Key Stage 2

### Wraparound clubs

We run a breakfast club from 7.45am and after-school care from 3.30pm to 5.30pm.

### Breakfast club

Breakfast club is £2.50 per session. It starts at 7.45am and the latest time for admission is 8.20am. The club operates on school premises in a safe environment and run by a team of high-quality, trained staff whose purpose is to make sure the children have the very best start to their day. The club offers a tasty and healthy breakfast, the most important meal of the day! Choices include:

- Range of cereals
- Breads – bagels, crumpets, toast, with various spreads
- Yoghurt
- Fruit
- Scrambled eggs
- Baked beans
- Milk or water

The breakfast club also provides a variety of free play and structured play with a broad range of activities and freedom for children to choose their own activities. Each morning Mr Cuming, our P.E. instructor, takes a selection of children onto the playground for a range of sports.

### Reading/exercise at Breakfast Club

Each child who attends breakfast club is expected to do 15 minutes of reading or participate in the 'Daily Mile' run from 8.30am to 8.45am. All games are tidied away. The children are given a period of time in which to read quietly or taken to the games area to exercise. Adults at breakfast club support children in their reading during this period of time. Those children who did not have a time to read at home the night before have the opportunity to catch up during the session. Mr Cuming, our PE instructor, leads the daily mile.

### After-school club

Our Lady & St Joseph Catholic Primary School provides after-school care provision. This service is invaluable to our school community. After-school care starts at 3.30pm and finishes at 5.30pm. It is separate and in addition to all the other after school clubs which we run. It costs £5.00 per session. During after-school care our children have the opportunity to read, complete their homework, play games and enjoy various sporting activities, supported by a team of high-quality trained staff. Each child receives a healthy snack. This helps them to boost their energy levels and keep them full until they get home for dinner. Snacks can include:

- A selection of soups with homemade bread
- A variety of drinks (milkshakes, pure orange or apple juice)
- A choice of sandwiches
- A selection of fruits
- A dessert, such as a flapjack or cake

## Uniform

Our Lady & St Joseph has a school uniform of which we are very proud and which all children must wear. To maintain the high standards at OLSJ, regular uniform inspections will be carried out to ensure everyone is adhering to our uniform policy. We are grateful for your ongoing support.

### Nursery – boys and girls

- Navy jogging bottoms  
In Summer, navy shorts can be worn
- Pale blue polo shirt
- Navy logo sweatshirt
- Any Velcro shoes – (no laces) Black

### Reception to Year 6

#### Jumper

- Navy OLSJ logo V-neck jumper

#### Shirt

- Short or long-sleeved white shirt

#### Tie

- OLSJ school tie (can be elasticated for Rec & Year 1)

#### Trousers/Skirt

- Plain dark-grey long trousers without turn ups (Straight leg/No combat style trousers)
- Dark grey knee length skirt
- Plain dark grey knee length pinafore

#### Socks/tights

- Plain grey, white or black socks
- Plain grey, tights

#### Shoes

- Plain, black shoes with no hidden toys, coloured tabs or illuminations
- Trainer style shoes may be worn if they are plain and not branded e.g. Nike, Adidas, Reebok etc.
- No ankle boots – all shoes must be below ankle height
- Children may wear wellington boots but change into shoes at school

#### Coats

- Preferably dark coloured waterproof coat with a hood

#### Bags

- Children should have an OLSJ logo bag which are available from uniform stockists

### In Summer, children can wear:

- A plain white polo shirt (logo optional)
- Plain dark grey shorts without turn ups (No combat style shorts)
- Dark blue check dress OR dark blue check culottes

(In Summer, no flip-flops or jelly shoes)

### P.E.

- Plain pale blue polo shirt
- Plain navy-blue shorts
- Black plimsolls OR completely black trainers (no logos)
- Optional navy tracksuit for outdoor PE during colder weather

### Hair

- Unusual (e.g. tram lines/steps/strips/motifs/mohawks/mohicans, etc) hairstyles including coloured extensions are not acceptable
- Hair that is collar length must be tied back at all times
- ONLY Navy blue or white hairbands/ribbons – NO OTHER FASHION HAIR ACCESSORIES
- Hair colour should be natural
- Haircuts should be no shorter than a grade 2

### Jewellery

- No ear-rings/studs/jewellery of any kind, except simple watches which can be worn from Year 2
- Ears should be pierced at the beginning of the Summer holidays. This will allow for time to heal. Children are not allowed to wear ear rings at OLSJ

### Make-Up

- No make-up (including lip-gloss, nail varnish/false nails)

### Sunglasses

- No sunglasses unless they are prescription and in place of regular glasses

### Swimming Y3, Y4, Y5, Y6

- Towel, swimming hat, trunks (not shorts) for boys; one-piece costume for girls

### Label uniform

- In order to avoid confusion and to keep 'Lost Property' to a minimum, all items of clothing, P.E. kit, bags etc, MUST be clearly labelled with name and class

# Key information

## Food in school

Our comprehensive lunch menu offers a wide choice of healthy foods. A balanced healthy, nutritious diet is important for the development of a child's physical state as well as their intellectual abilities. Feeding the body with the proper nutrients helps fuel the mind to be more receptive to learning new skills. Our dining room makes the provision and consumption of food an enjoyable and safe experience in a pleasurable and dedicated environment. Food provision in the school reflects the ethical, cultural and medical requirements of staff and pupils.

### Packed lunches

We work with parents to ensure that packed lunches abide by the suggestions listed below. Note that this is not an exhaustive list.

- At least one portion of fruit and one portion
- Vegetables every day.
- Meat, fish or other sources of non-dairy protein (e.g. lentils, kidney beans, chickpeas, hummus, and falafel) every day.
- Oily fish, such as salmon, at least once every

three weeks.

- A starchy food such as any type of bread, pasta, rice, couscous, noodles, potatoes or other type of cereals every day.
- Dairy food such as milk, cheese, yoghurt, fromage frais or custard every day.

- Water – flasks brought from home can be topped up during the day.

We do not allow fizzy drinks, crisps, sweets, confectionery, such as chocolate bars or chocolate-coated biscuits, during the school day. As fridge space is not available in school, pupils are advised to bring packed lunches in insulated bags with freezer blocks where possible to stop food going off. Packed lunchboxes are monitored and parents notified of any imbalanced contents.

### Free school meals

All primary school children in Tower Hamlets schools are eligible for free school meals. For children in Nursery the cost is currently £2.15 per day.

### Fruit, drinks and snacks

The school discourages the consumption of food high in fat and sugar and foods with

nut products at break-time. We do not allow crisps, sweets or chocolates. In the Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 children are provided with a piece of fruit as a snack. At Key Stage 2 we advise parents to send any of the following items: whole pieces of fresh fruit e.g. banana, apple, pear, satsuma, grapes, vegetable sticks, raw vegetables such as carrots, peppers, cucumber and celery. All pupils are encouraged to bring a bottle of water to school every day and can refill their drinking bottles at break time. Pupils may drink their water at any time of the day except during liturgy or assembly.

Early Years Foundation Stage take part in the Nursery milk scheme. Milk is available for the children to drink during the day in both Nursery and Reception. The children bring in water bottles in Reception and have a self-service water jug in Nursery.

### Allergies

If your child has a food allergy, please inform the school or if you child develops an allergy during their time at OLSJ please inform the school.

# Working with parents

## Parent evenings and reports

Parent consultations are held twice a year and a written report is provided annually.

## The Governing Board

### Foundation Governors

Foundation governors are volunteers who serve as the Bishop's representative to assist in managing our Catholic schools. They work alongside other governors including parent governors to form a governing body or board of directors. They are involved in decisions about all aspects of managing the school – such as buildings, budgets, supporting staff, monitoring standards and the Catholic ethos as well as helping make big decisions about the school's long-term goals. Foundation Governors have specific responsibility for admissions to the school, the employment of staff, Religious Education and collective worship. The governors help determine the future for pupils attending our schools.

The work of the Governing Body is facilitated by a Clerk and training and support for governors is provided by the Diocesan Department for Schools and Colleges and the Local Authority.

### Parent Governors

These are parents of children who attend Our Lady & St Joseph Catholic Primary School. They are elected on to the Governing Body by the votes of other parents, and they represent the voice of the "users" of the school. Their term of office runs for four years.

### Local Authority Governor

The Local Authority (LB Tower Hamlets) appoints a representative to the school's governing body.

The Governors can be contacted through the school.

## Communication with parents

We like to feel that, in partnership with parents, we are a team working together to create an environment of excellence where each child is valued, nurtured and guided in preparation to face the challenges ahead with confidence. We believe that a positive relationship between home and school is extremely important.

### Working together

We encourage parents to take a real interest in their child's schooling and to work together with the school in helping them to achieve the very best standards.

## Contacting Parents

Accidents happen in school as they do elsewhere in the community. We are able to provide first aid where necessary. If your child is taken ill at school or has an accident, it is important that we can get in touch with you. Please make sure we have your correct address and telephone numbers for home and work and the name and address of a friend or relative who we could contact if we cannot get through to you.



# Frequently Asked Questions

Here are our answers to what we find are the most frequently asked questions. If you have any questions that are not answered here, please contact the school office and we will be happy to help.

## Attendance

Regular and punctual school attendance is important. Pupils need to attend school regularly if they are to take full advantage of the educational opportunities available to them by law. Children who are persistently late or absent soon fall behind with their learning. Children who are absent from school frequently develop large gaps in their learning which will impact on their progress and their ability to meet age related learning expectations. A child whose attendance drops to 90% each year will, over their time at primary school, have missed two whole terms of learning.

### Report an absence

If your child is unable to attend school because of illness you must telephone the school office on 0203 764 8860 by 9.00am on each day of the absence. If we do not hear from you, the School Attendance Officer will call to discuss the reason for non-attendance.

## Illness

If absence due to illness is likely to continue for an extended period, or be a repetitive absence, the school will contact the support services to see if arrangements can be made for the child to be given some home tuition outside school. Where, over the course of an academic year, a child has repeated periods of illness, the school will write to parents/carers to ask them to provide medical evidence for each future period of illness related absence. This evidence could be a Doctor's note, appointment card or copy of a prescription. The school may seek written permission from parents/carers to make their own enquiries.

## Holidays in term time

Children are not permitted to take holidays in term time and these will not be authorised, unless in very exceptional circumstances, which the Headteacher must be satisfied about. If the leave is not authorised by the Headteacher and children are absent during the requested time, parents may receive a penalty notice (fine). This is because absence from school is disruptive to children's education and affects their achievement.

### Request for leave of absence in term time

You need to complete a leave of absence request form at least 10 days before the start

of the proposed leave. The completed form must then be sent to the school for approval and the school will then write to you within 7 school working days to confirm/decline the request.

### Penalties

If your child has unauthorized absence for more than 3 days, they will lose their place in Breakfast Club and/or After School Care for a 1-week period, beginning on the first day of return, and you will then have to reapply for a place. This is not negotiable. Your child will also lose their place in any after school club in which they are participating for the remainder of the term. When considering places for future clubs, we will take into consideration the unauthorised absence when clubs are oversubscribed.

If you take your child/children on holiday during term time for an extended period you risk losing your child/children's place at Our Lady & St Joseph Catholic Primary School. Parents will then have to re-apply for admission when they return but it may not be possible for the pupil to return to this school.

## Medicine in school

The school can only administer medication that has been prescribed by a doctor. A medication form will need to be completed and signed to give authorisation.

## Mobile phones

Mobile phones are not allowed in school.

## Helping to support children's learning at home

Homework is given every week and will vary in type and duration as your child progresses through the school. Please make sure that children do their homework independently, so we can see what they can actually do. If at any point your child experiences difficulty with homework please do not hesitate to contact the class teacher – preferably before the homework is due to be handed in, so that help and guidance can be provided.

## Special educational needs and disabilities

At Our Lady & St Joseph Catholic Primary School and Nursery all children, regardless of their particular needs, are provided with inclusive teaching which will enable them to make the best possible progress in school and feel that they are a valued member of the wider school community. We expect that all children with SEND will meet or exceed the high expectations we set for them based on their age and starting points.

### Support

We will ensure children with SEND receive the support they need. Ambitious educational and wider outcomes will be set for each child in partnership with their parents and the child themselves.

We want all children to become confident individuals who will be able to make a successful transition on to the next phase of their educational journey and into adulthood.

### Gifted and talented pupils

Our Lady & St Joseph Gifted and Talented policy aims to identify and support children who have the potential to achieve higher than the expected level for their academic year.

Our Aims for Gifted and Talented Children:

- To identify children who are gifted and talented including those who are underachieving.
- To ensure that pupils with outstanding or exceptional abilities are supported to make appropriate progress.
- To develop a curriculum that is broad and balanced and which impacts on the achievements of the gifted and talented.
- To provide opportunities that will boost the achievements of the gifted and talented both in and outside of the classroom.
- To implement the values of inclusion so that the potential of gifted and talented pupils can be realised.

Charging policy

All education during school hours is free. We do not charge for any activity undertaken as part of the National Curriculum.

Voluntary contributions

When organising school trips or visits which enrich the curriculum and educational experience of the children, the school invites parents to contribute to the cost of the trip. All contributions are voluntary. If we do not receive sufficient voluntary contributions, we may cancel a trip.

If a trip goes ahead, it may include children whose parents have not paid any contribution. We do not treat these children differently from any others. If a parent wishes their child to take part in a school trip or event, but is unwilling or unable to make a voluntary contribution, we do allow the child to participate fully in the trip or activity. Sometimes the school pays additional costs in order to support the visit.

Residential visits

If the school organises a residential visit in school time or mainly school time, which is to provide education directly related to the National Curriculum, we do not charge. However, we do make a charge to cover the costs of board and lodging. Parents of children entitled to Pupil Premium as it is presently constituted may approach the school to request a discounted fee.

Internet safety

With the incredible advances in technology in recent years, e-safety is an increasingly complex and important aspect of your child’s education and life in general in the 21st century.

Of course, we do our utmost to ensure that your child is safe when using technology within our school setting. We have strict procedures and a high level of filtering to ensure that our children are not exposed to any unsuitable material whilst at school.

Clubs, activities, trips and visits

Educational visits and residential trips

We believe that learning extends beyond the classroom and so we use additional enriching activities to develop children’s learning even further. Parents will be given full details of lunchtime and after-school clubs as and when these are available.

Sport and P.E.

Every child in our school takes part in two P.E. lessons per week, taught by our P.E. coach, class teachers. We cover a wide range of sporting activities such as dance, gymnastics, swimming, team games, invasion games, athletics, striking and fielding games, racket sports and outdoor and adventurous activities. Children are also encouraged to take part in physical activities during their break and lunch time with equipment available for them to use.

At OLSJ, we run after school sports clubs and all children are welcome to apply for the clubs that they are enthusiastic and passionate about.

Children at OLSJ are given opportunities to represent our school in competitive sport as part of cluster tournaments within the borough of Tower Hamlets. Children are also given the opportunity to compete in cross-borough competitions.

At OLSJ we regularly organise internal competitions as well as sports days to increase the number of children who are able to raise their fitness and nurture a talent in a sporting environment.

Music

Music is integral to life at OLSJ. Children take part in one Music lesson every week, delivered by a specialist Music teacher. The lessons not only cover the National Curriculum but children also apply their understanding of the inter-related dimensions of music, developed from an early age, to a variety of projects which make cross-curricular links with their learning in other subject areas.

Children who are identified as Gifted and Talented are offered extra one-to-one support by the Music teacher to nurture their talents. In addition to this, all children regularly practice singing throughout the week during hymn practices, assemblies, and Mass. Each child participates in a variety of performances over the year.

Issues concerning children’s welfare

If you are concerned about any aspect of your child’s schooling the first step is to speak to the class teacher. If it is a confidential or complex matter do not try to deal with it immediately before or after school, but ask to see the teacher at a suitable time.

Emergency arrangements

We will, of course, endeavour to keep the school open if at all possible, but severe weather conditions could make it necessary to close the school if it were dangerous or unreasonably difficult:

- For children or sufficient numbers of staff to reach school and provide an adequate educational service.
- For children or staff to journey to and return from school safely and without undue delay.

Such an early release will only be contemplated in very extreme situations. All parents/carers are urged to ensure that mobile phones are always switched on and audible in case we are trying to contact you.
