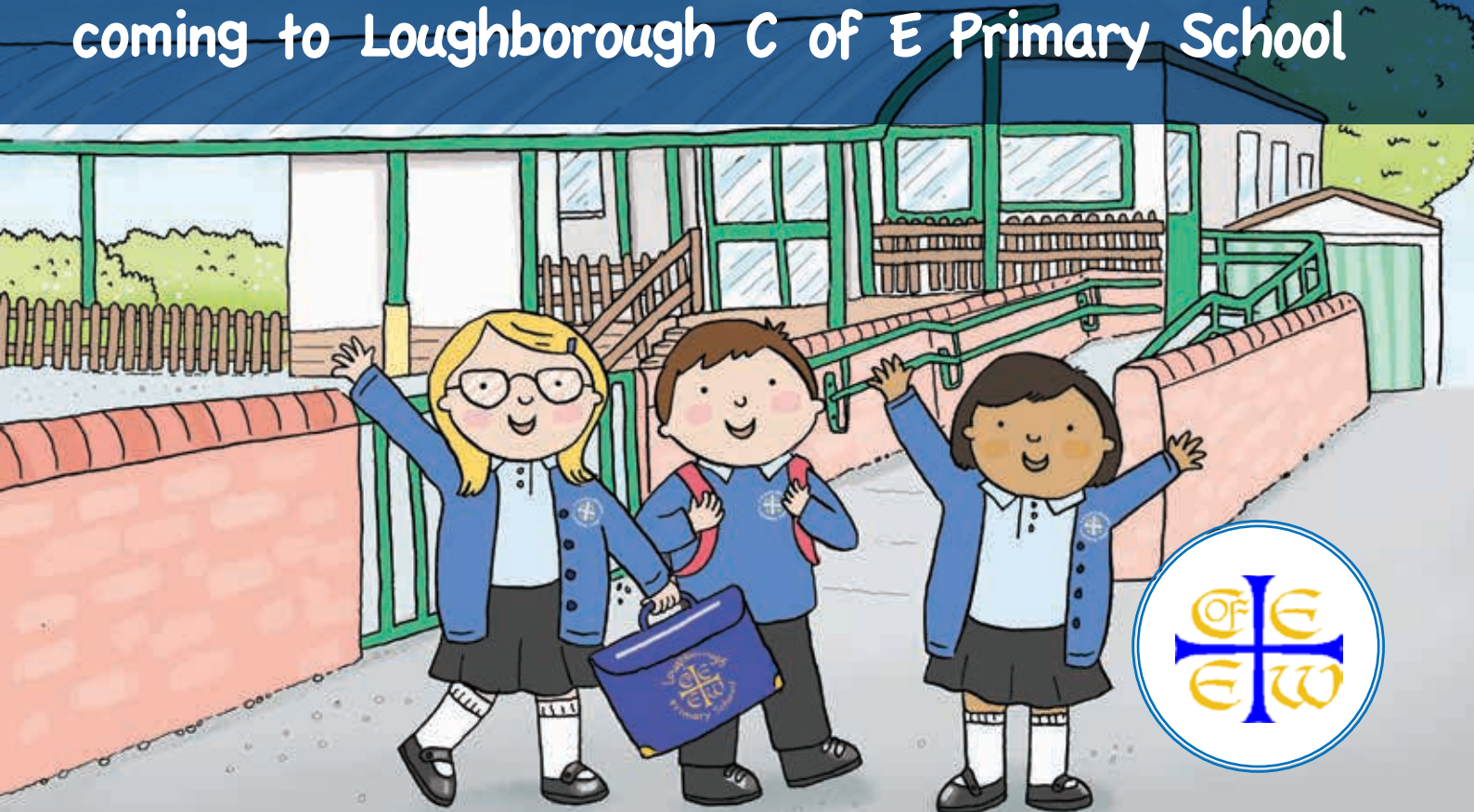


Millie, James and Aamira are excited to be coming to Loughborough C of E Primary School

As all the children are now settled in school, their grown-ups leave.



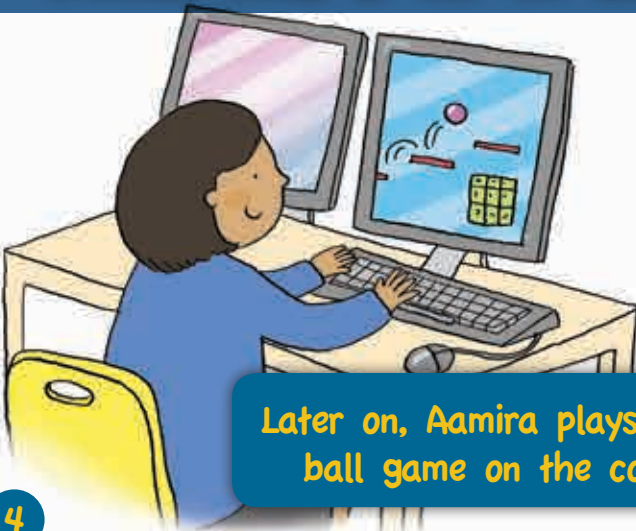
Are you looking forward to starting school?

James is drawing and needs to go to the toilet. He puts his hand up to let his teacher know.

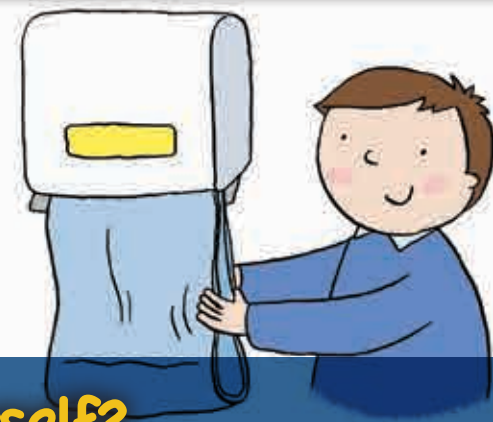
"That's fine, James," says his teacher. "The toilet is right here."
