

# What happens when I come to school?





Before you leave for school, your grown-ups will help make sure you get ready and have breakfast so you can arrive at school on time. Your breakfast will give you lots of energy for the school day.

Your grown-ups will bring you to the classroom door, where your friendly teacher will be waiting to greet you.

# What happens when I need to go to the toilet?




# What happens at the end of the school day?
