
What happens at the end of the day?

At the end of the school day, you will help the teachers put everything away and tidy up.

Then you will sit on the carpet and listen to a story, sing a song or have 'Show and Tell'. Show and Tell is where you can bring something special in from home and tell your friends all about it.

You may also sit around a table and talk about what you have learnt that day. Jack is telling his teacher about what he has learnt about kindness.

When it is time to go home, you will fetch your coat and bag from your locker. You will take home your reading book every day to look at with your grown-ups. You may also get chosen to take home a prayer bag and your grown-ups can put photos in it of you saying your prayers at home.



Your teacher will go to the classroom door and when they see your grown-up outside, they will call your name. Then you can go home with your grown-up.
