

What happens when I get to school?



If you are starting in Reception, you will come to visit us in the summer term before you start here. You can try out some activities and get to know your new friends.

We are very friendly at St. Peter's and we want you to be happy here and settle in quickly.

Before you join us, your new teacher will come to see you at home or at your Nursery so you can get to know each other. We will give you a book bag before you start which you will bring to school with you each day.



At the end of the day, we take our book bags home to look through them with our grown-ups. When we have finished our reading book, we bring it back to school and get another one.

Before you start, you will also have a school lunch here with your grown-up. You can also come to a Teddy Bears' picnic.

Katie has brought her teddy to the picnic.

When you get to school, your grown-ups will take you into school to help you get settled in. Early Years children have their own special school entrance.

Remember to bring your freshly filled water bottle to school with you every day so you can have a drink when you are thirsty.

You will hang up your coat on the coat peg with your name and photo on it, and say goodbye to your grown-ups.

Then you will go into your classroom to start your day at school.

"It is so easy to use the toilets by myself," she says. "Everything here is just the right size for me!"




What makes our school so special?
