

What happens when I get to school?

Alice and Olivia are having lots of fun playing with Play-Doh. "It's very squishy," says Olivia.


There are lots of activities to choose from, both indoors and outdoors.

Alice, Olivia and Jacob like eating bananas.


At lunchtime, your teacher will take you into the hall and help you collect your meal from the serving area. Your grown-ups will have already ordered your meal online.

Alice, Olivia and Jacob always have a fantastically fun time at school.


Sometimes there are assemblies where teachers, the Rector or visitors will talk to you about Jesus and God. Sometimes there are songs and prayers.
