




Instilling a love of learning

When you arrive at the Ocean Centre, you pop a 'day of the week' card in the check-in board so we know who is in class today.


Are you excited about coming to the Ocean Centre?

Ravi and his new friends are using number cards to work out the answers to the Maths problems their teacher has put on the white board.




You will also practise your writing each day.

You will have individual targets which are called ISPs. Every day your teacher will help you work on these. We like to celebrate all your good progress!




What are you looking forward to learning at school?

You will have a snack break in the morning. You will have fresh fruit and vegetables to eat, and water or milk to drink.


Ravi is pouring himself some water as his friend Jay sips his milk.

At lunchtime you all go out to play until your class is called in for lunch. There are lots of kind adults outside to help you have fun, make friends and join in the playground games.


When you go in for lunch, there are grown-ups to help you get the food you want. Then you sit with your friends.

There are adults at the pool to help you get dressed and undressed and to help you in and out of the pool.



During most afternoons, you will go to your mainstream class.


You will learn about Science, History, Geography, PE and lots of other interesting topics. Everyone enjoys getting to know new friends in their class and talking about what they are learning.
