"Hello, everyone.


I am so pleased to see you,"

"Please may I go to the toilet?" asks Ali.


"Yes, of course," says his teacher. "We will see you back here soon."

After the song, you will say goodbye to your classmates and collect your bag and coat ready to go home.


You will go to a different classroom to wait for your minibus, taxi or grown-up to collect you. Help is always available if you need it.
