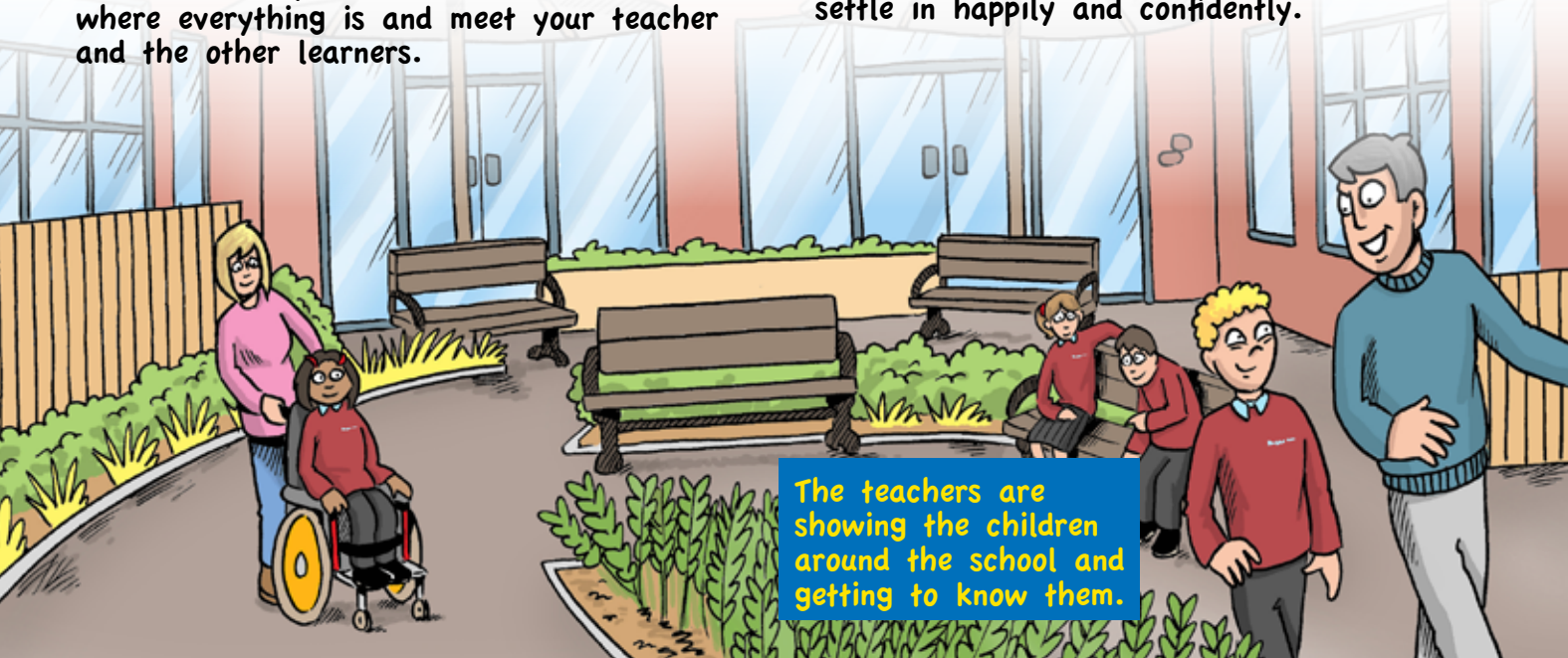

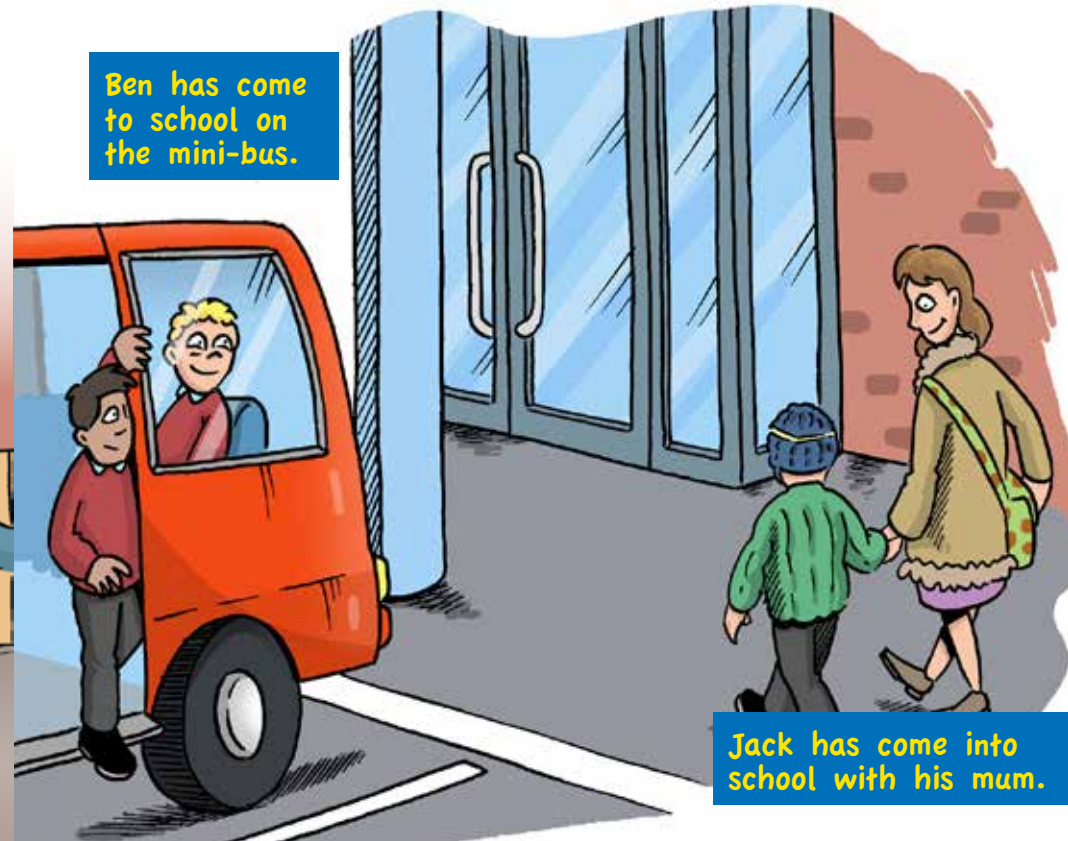

## What extra help will I get at Selworthy?

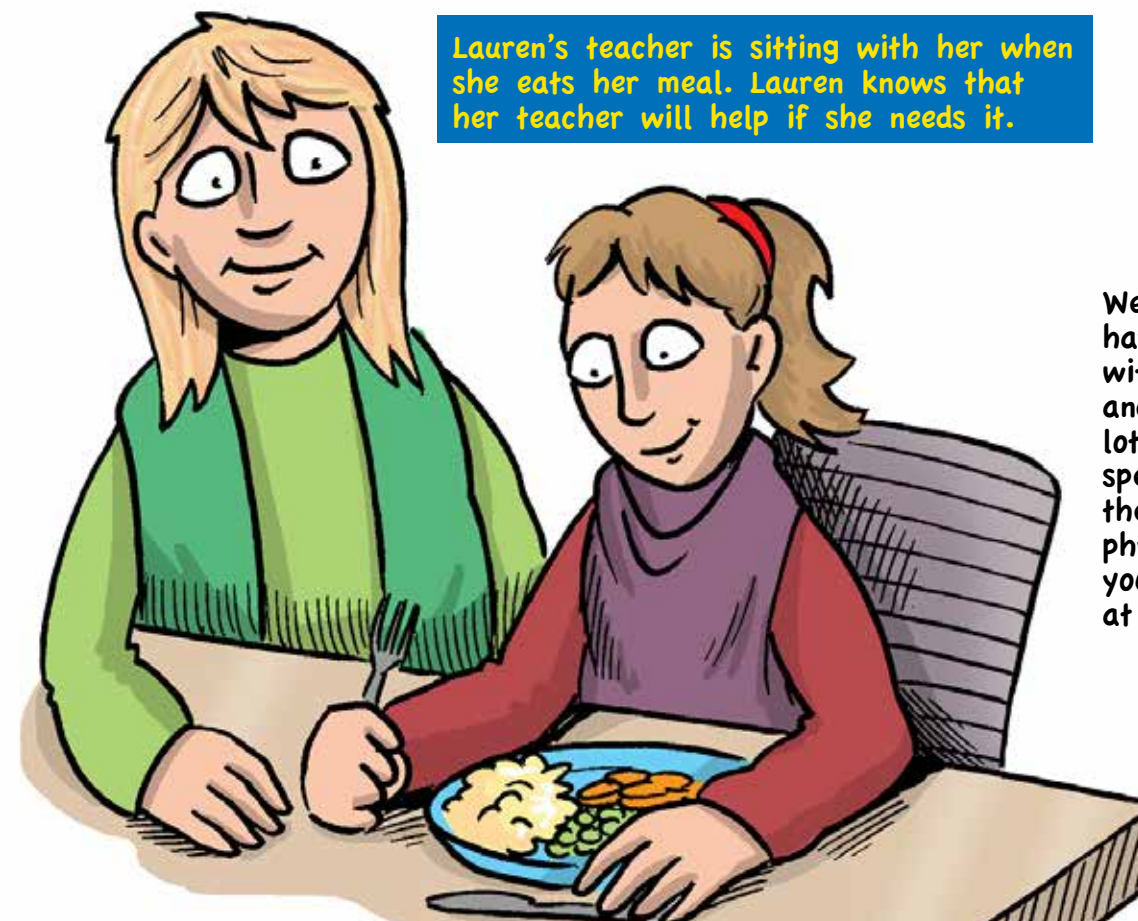


Sophia, Ben and Lauren are enjoying being in a small, friendly class.

## What happens at the end of the day?



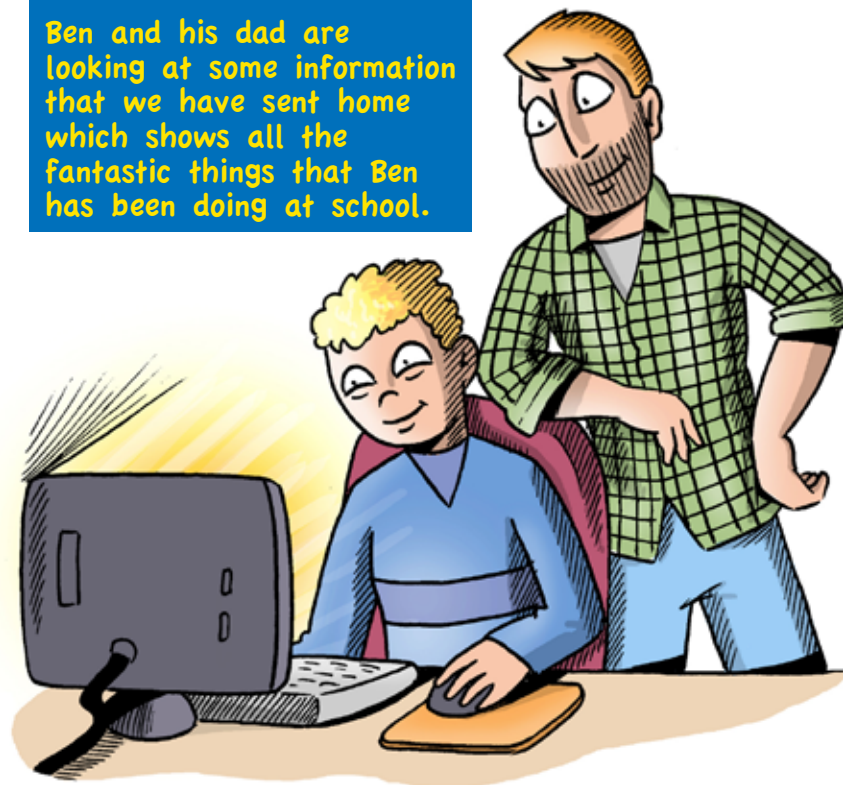
Jack's teachers are telling him how proud they are about how he has been doing.
