What happens when I get to school?

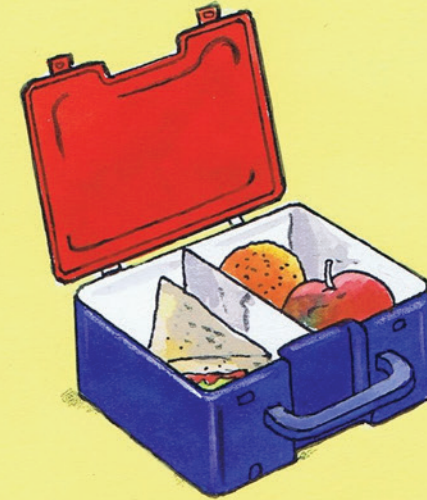

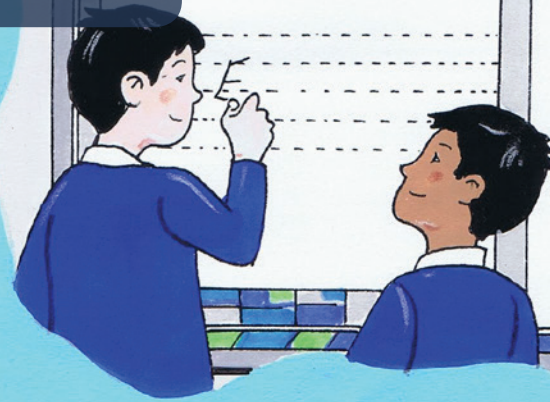

In the afternoon there are lots of other exciting things to do such as playing outside, swimming and gardening.

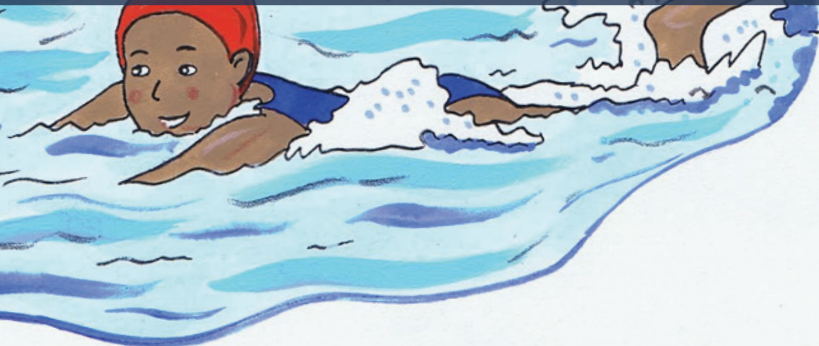
Sanjeev and Edward are playing in the Forest school. Einstein has seen a squirrel run up the tree.
