"I love oranges and bananas," says Darnay.



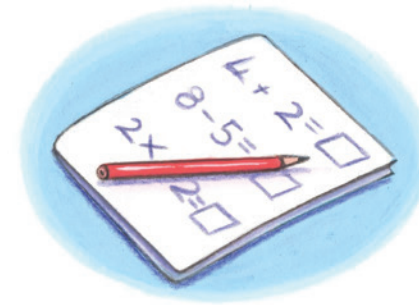
How do you feel about coming to our Nurture Group?
