Knowledge and skills

We are committed to offering our pupils a curriculum which excites and interests them and helps them to gain the knowledge and develop the skills which give them strong foundations for their next steps in education and in life. The education we provide is based on the National Curriculum but is tailored by our experienced teachers for our school to build on pupils' needs and interests and utilise the opportunities that our local area offers.

We believe that a good education is more than just about filling children with knowledge and facts. It should also be about giving children the opportunity to develop their social, emotional and communication skills such as; collaboration and teamwork, communication, empathy and oroblem solving. We aim to teach children how to grow into positive, resilient and responsible people who can work and cooperate with others to learn the knowledge, understanding and skills that will enable them to achieve their full potential

Curriculum coverage

We deliver learning through a creative projectbased approach this means that objectives from several foundation subjects may all be covered in one session rather than in traditional stand alone subjects. English and maths will generally have their own lessons but they may be linked to the overall topic too.

Organisation and planning

At this time we have some mixed age classes at Shotley and therefore we plan topics on a rolling basis to make sure that children are getting a good variety of subject coverage over their time at the

school. We create detailed medium term plans for each term which detail the learning and skills to be covered for each subject area and how these are linked together in the topic.

Keeping families in touch with learning

Apart from the formal termly parents' evenings and regular newsletters we have a variety of ways to include you in children's learning. We have the usual reading diaries, spellings and homework for you to help your child with. But in addition to this teachers' and nursery by providing carefully planned play topic plans are shared with parents via a termly 'learning poster' which lets families know what each year group is going to be focussing on. The school and individual classes also have Twitter accounts and regularly Tweet sharing news and post photos to show what classes have been up to.

The Early Years Foundation Stage

Our reception children are taught the curriculum set out in the Early years / Foundation Stage curriculum document.

Learning through play

Teaching in reception builds on the knowledge and experiences that children bring from home based activities as well as structured learning time with an adult. Children learn indoors and outdoors; they take part in creative, physical, social and collaborative activities. It can be busy, calm, messy ... and always fun!

Learning doesn't just happen at desks

We are very fortunate that our school has amazing grounds, we have a big grass field, a pond, outdoor classrooms, raised beds and a greenhouse and even our own little Spinny for woodland exploring and adventures. We also have a good relationship with our neighbouring farm and classes often visit to learn about their work and to use the land for walks - the neighbouring woods are also used for field work and den building!

The wider area

Classes also walk down to the shore at Shotley Gate and to the marina, to study the docks opposite or to do field work on the river. We also make regular visits beyond the peninsula to theatre, museums, castles and other nearby localities as a part of our

topics. Year 5 and 6 also go on a residential trip for five days in the spring, every other year.

We also welcome visitors to the school to share their knowledge, skills and expertise with us, these have included sporting role models, war veterans, musicians, theatres and local artists as well as experts on healthy eating, science and history. It all helps to bring our learning to life!

PE, sport and music

Competitive sports

Shotley is committed to giving all pupils the opportunity to compete in competitive sports. We have been able to increase opportunities for competition in our extra-curricular time through the use of the P.E. and Sports premium whilst retaining current values in our teaching. We challenge the

pupils to enjoy being active and use their creativity and imagination.

They learn new skills, find out how to use them in different ways, and to link these skills in order to create actions, phrases and sequences of movement. We encourage the pupils to communicate, collaborate and compete with each other. They are also encouraged to take on leadership roles within lessons, particularly the older children who also assist with inter-house tournaments and sports events by leading the children in their house and organising equipment scoring and timing.

Music

At Shotley School we encourage all children to enjoy a wide range of music. This includes an appreciation of musical influences from other countries, cultures, and throughout history.

The children are encouraged to play a range of percussion and tuned instruments to interpret different experiences, including stories, poetry and feelings. We follow a scheme called Charanga and the children have the opportunity to learn a musical instrument during their time at the school.

Special Educational Needs and disabilities

Shotley Community Primary School is an inclusive school and is committed to supporting children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND). Children may be classed as having SEND if they have a significantly greater difficulty in learning than the majority of children of the same age.

Children's needs will fall into one of four broad areas of need;

- Communication, language and interaction (e.g. speech and language difficulties or Autistic Spectrum Disorder)
- Cognition and learning (e.g. learning difficulties including specific learning difficulties such as dvslexia)
- Social, emotional and mental health difficulties (e.g. anxiety, depression, Attention Deficit Disorder)
- Sensory and / or physical needs (e.g vision or hearing impairment or physical disabilities)

We aim to give highly personalised support to every child. We are an inclusive school which means we recognise how every learner is different and we work hard to make sure everyone's achievements

best possible progress for all our pupils whatever their needs or abilities. Our broad, balanced, creative curriculum and enrichment activities provide opportunities for everyone to achieve and succeed. At Shotley School we will: • Seek to identify the needs of pupils with SEND as early as possible. • Track and monitor all pupils to ensure that they make good progress and any additional needs are identified and addressed guickly • Overcome barriers to learning and ensure that all pupils have full access to the curriculum • Work closely with parents to gain a better understanding of our children. This includes supporting parents in terms of understanding SEND procedures and practices and providing regular feedback on their child's progress • Work with, and in support of, external agencies when the school alone cannot meet pupils' needs. • Create a school environment where pupils can contribute to their own learning. This means encouraging relationships with adults in school where pupils feel safe to voice their opinions of their own needs. • Encourage pupil participation in wider opportunities such as school council, class councils, residential visits, school plays, sporting activities, charitable fundraising etc. Reviews of a

are celebrated. We are committed to ensuring the

child's progress will be made regularly. The review process will evaluate the impact and quality of any support and interventions. It will also take account of the views of the pupil and their parents. We will then make any necessary amendments to the provision in consultation with the parents and the pupil. If the pupil is still making insufficient progress, we may seek further advice and support from outside professionals. Pupils and parents will be fully involved and kept informed about the involvement of external agencies and proposed interventions. Parents are encouraged to be a part of this process and staff meet regularly with parents to report on progress. If you are concerned that your child has additional needs please contact the Class Teacher in the first instance.

How accessible is the school environment? Adaptations have been made to the school environment to ensure it is fully accessible for anyone with a disability.

Meeting all children's needs

All children are individuals with their own interests, talents and needs, each has different areas of learning which they may find easier or more challenging. We regularly assess children to identify gaps in learning and plan opportunities to address these as part of whole class teaching, or support the individual through intervention or support outside of lesson time.

The school is wheelchair accessible through four entrances around the school and there is an internal ramp to allow access up the small number of steps between Key Stages 1 and 2. There is a disabled accessible toilet.

No limits on learning

We recognise that all children are individuals with their own specific needs, gifts and talents. Children will always be set work at the right level of challenge for them and appropriate for their year group, even in mixed age classes. We have a policy of having 'no limits on learning' so children are not pigeon-holed into one specific 'ability' group but are free to choose from a range of activities provided depending on their level of confidence

Joining us at Shotley School
