




When you are still in Year 2, your new Year 3 teachers will visit your class to say "Hello".

"I love playing music. It's so much fun learning a new instrument," says Jamal.


Michael is playing tennis with Izzy, who is very good at it.

"| Know why the giraffe has a long neck now!" he says.


What trips will | go on with my class?
