"Thanks," says Alisha. "You have helped me so much Katie."




Harry and Tobias have joined in playing football with some older boys.

Some of the brilliant things you will be doing include:


- · learning Latin

Tobias is learning to play the recorder. He is enjoying playing music with his friends




Harry is playing table tennis at an after—school club. Rory and Lucy are good at table tennis as they have been coming to the club for a while. They are showing Harry how to play.

Harry is learning all about the ingenious Victorian inventors.


"I am really enjoying learning about the amazing things the Victorians invented," says Harry.
